Personal Care

“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

JonesCare will provide assistance with eating and drinking as needed.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

JonesCare will provide assistance with toileting as needed.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

At JonesCare, there will always be a qualified caregiver to assist the resident with walking when needed.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

JonesCare provides assistance with transferring a resident using the appropriate transferring tools and techniques.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

JonesCare will provide positioning assistance when needed.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

JonesCare will provide assistance with personal hygiene such as teeth brushing etc., when needed.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

JonesCare will provide assistance with dressing as needed. For example, a caregiver may help with morning dressing assistance from night clothes to day clothes and then evening dressing back into night clothes.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

JonesCare provides assistance with two showers per week. More than two showers per week may be assisted if needed.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

Laundry service and light housekeeping are provided by JonesCare. Additional personal services may be added.

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. (WAC 388-76-10430)

The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is:

JonesCare provides medication assistance according to the WAC. Assistance with medications and

medical needs are generally identified in the assessment and care plan. Medications will be kept in locked storage.

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services:

JonesCare will contract with a qualified nurse in the state of Washington to provide skilled nursing services. Most of the time if nursing services are referred by the primary care physician, a home health nurse will be involved in the care and rehabilitation of the resident. JonesCare does contract with a qualified nurse for nurse deligated tasks.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

The nurse delegator will only deligate tasks he or she is legally able to delegate and where he or she feels comfortable in delegating such task. Tasks that are normally delegated by the delegating nurse are cathater care, medication management, addressing non-sterel wound care, feeding line flushing and mangement, and more as the nurse delegator sees necessary.

Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home.
- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: **Home health nurses as prescribed**
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: _____
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: **At least one CNA available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week; however, usually there are two CNA's available in the evening and morning.**

Medicaid

Privately-paying clients who, in the future may seek and obtain funding via the Medicaid/Medicare program for purposes of paying for community-based long term care services, may become eligible to receive those services in this Facility.
