Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

set up only, cuing and monitoring to total assistance, feeding tube support and puree food

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

cuing and monitoring up to full incontinence support with bladder and bowel

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

cuing and monitoring to a one person assist, use of walker or cane

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

we provide transferring assistance from cuing and monitoring to a one or two person assist and has a standby hoier lift always if needed.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

we provide positioning assistance from cuing and monitoring to one or two person assist. We make sure that we reposition residents at least every 2 hour.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

we provide personal hygiene assistance from cuing and set up to total assistance

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

we provide dressing assistance from cuing and set up to total assistance

8. BATHING

we provide bathing assistance from cuing and set up to total assistance.

Medication Services

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

Staffing
