“Personal care services” means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident’s needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

Assist with eating by cueing, reminding, monitoring, cutting up food, and spoon feeding if necessary.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

Assist with toileting from setting up, monitor, encourage or cue.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

Assist with walking using cane, wheelchair, walker, and transfer using Hoyer lift.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Transfer by hands-on guiding, or using devices like Hoyer lifts and gait belts.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Monitor and reposition at select time intervals.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Setup, encourage, cue, monitor and guide throughout task completion.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

Setup, encourage, cue, monitor, layout clothing items, guide and help throughout task completion.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

Setup supplies, monitor, cue, help get in/out of shower, partial to total assistance throughout washing, including bed baths.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

We provide assistance with any personal care task, based on individual needs and abilities.

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is:

Order, prepare, monitor, document and store medications in locked cabinets and containers. Remind and administer correct dose as instructed by nurse delegation.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING MEDICATION SERVICES

All medication is administered per nurse delegation instructions and strict doctor's order.

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services:

All skilled nurse services are provided by licensed health agencies or hospice care. Some task may be delegated to caregivers. These services are paid by individual's health insurance or private pay.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

Delegated nurse service may include blood glucose, catheter care, oxygen administration and simple wound care.

Staff is trained to perform nurse delegation as required by Washington Administrative Core.

Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home.
- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: available upon request
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: available upon request
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: 24 hours care
- Awake staff at night
- Other: **Doctor home visits available upon request**

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING STAFFING

All care staff is certified according to WAC 388-76 instructions.

Cultural or Language Access
