**Staffing**

- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: is readily available and provides ongoing assistance to the staff and resident. The provider is a RN
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: n/a
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: 24 hours/ day, seven days a week
- Awake staff at night
- Other: Awake staff at night is available for additional fee if needed for the safety of the residents
