Staffing

- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: *as needed only for Nurse Delegation*
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: *as needed only for Nurse Delegation*
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: *5 days and 2 days shift / 24 hrs with one caregiver and a house keeper*
- Awake staff at night
- Other: ** 2 caregiver as needed for 2-person assist reside.*

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING STAFFING *Live-in caregiver is on duty 24 hours a day with sleep time at 10 pm - 6am but provides assistance at night as needed*

Cultural or Language Access
