Personal Care

Staffing

- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: *RN owned available 7 days / week*
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: *on site & offsite by phone*
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: *7 days 24 hours*
- Awake staff at night
- Other:
