Personal Care

1. EATING

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

All stages from independent to total assistance.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

All stages from independent to one person assist.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

All stages from independent, one person transfer, two people or hooyer lift transfer.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

All stages from independent to two person assist.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

All stages from independent to two person assist.

7. DRESSING

Medication Services

Staffing

The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

Medicaid
