Personal Care

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

Assist with toileting needs depending on the client's level of care.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

From cueing, stand-by assist, and use of mechanical devices as needed

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

From cueing, stand-by assist, and use of mechanical devices as needed

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Will offer repositioning every 2 hours and as needed, and also cue/assist residents requiring reminder.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Will offer assistance in set-up, cueing, supervision and total assistance

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

From set-up, cueing, total assistance while respecting resident choices

From set-up, cueing, partial/total assistance
