Personal Care

Assist with changing depends, wiping, cleaning, transferring to and from the toilet, and/wheelchair or bed

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

Help with assistive devices, stand by assist when ambulating, pushing wheelchair

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Assist with transfer to and from wheelchair to bed, toilet and viseversa, Hoyerlift

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Assist resident with repositioning every two hours
