Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

From verbal cuing, to one to one feeding assistance as needed.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

From Q2H reminders, urine incontinent care, to total incontinent care.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

From supervised stand by assist, gait belt and or walkers, to one person side by side ambulation assistance...

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

From supervision, one person assist, transfer boards, sit to stand equipment, hooyer lift.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

From cuing, to one person assist every two hours or as needed.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Assistance with personal hygiene from prompting, grooming, to total care.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

From set up, partial assist, to total dressing assistance.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

From cuing and or supervision, one person assist, to bed showers.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

Privacy and dignity are always maintained when assistance is needed and or provided.

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. (WAC 388-76-10430)

The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is:

From medication reminders, to nurse delegated medication administration including insulins.

Most if not all medication passes will require pre-delegation authorization.

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

Medication administration including insulin, G tube feedings, Wound care

Staffing

The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home.
- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: On call
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: _____

Cultural or Language Access
