## Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

### 1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

**Cater to most diet needs, such as dysphagia, diabetic options, fluid restrictions, allergies, cuing and assist**

### 2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

**From cuing to total care.**

### 3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

**From cuing and monitoring to total assistance.**

### 4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

**cuing, to total dependance, hoyer lift 2 person transfers.**

### 5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

**We provide assistance with repositioning, cuing to total assistance.**

### 6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

**Independent, cuing, high assistance to total dependence.**

### 7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

**Independent, cuing, light asstance to total dependence.**

### 8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

**Independent to total assist. Roll-in shower or bed bath available.**

## Medication Services

### Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- The provider lives in the home.
- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:

- Registered nurse, days and times: **When needed**
- Licensed practical nurse, days and times: \_\_\_\_\_
- Certified nursing assistant or long term care workers, days and times: **24/7**
- Awake staff at night
- Other: **Wake staff when deemed appropriate.**
