Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

Meals are cooked by staff, served and residents are assisted from cuing, monitoring, cutting up food, special diets, to total feeding assistance. Cultural and medical issues are observed. Individual choices and snacks also addressed

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

All toileting help will be provided from cuing, and monitoring to total assistance.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

All walking assistance will be provided including stand-by- assist or one person assist. Also staff trained to use gait belts for mobility as needed

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

All transferring assistance will be provided including stand-by assist or one person physical assist and transfers with Hoyer.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows

Resident who needs repositioning are turned and repositioned every 2 hours for comfort

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

All personal hygiene assistance will be provided including cuing and reminders to total assistance such as showers, oral care and incontinence care.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

All dressing assistance will be provided from cuing and reminders to set up and total assistance. Dressing assistance includes dressing appropriately for occasion, weather and cleanliness.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

Sowers are available as set for those that are capable and staff will assist from reminders to total assistance based on their needs

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE:

Residents have their preferences of their hair styles and some can have it done professionally as needed

Medication Services

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation
