The home provide supervision ,extension,to total assistance to client.this includes peri care,changing depense,transferring.We respect clients choices .and make sure client is safe all the time.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

The home provides monitoring,supervision,extensive and total assitance,which includes :directing clients ,cueing,monitoring.Client may used walker,wheelchair,cane.we make sure that all walk ways are cleared and safe to walk on.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

The home provides monitoring,supervision,extensive,total assistance to client .gait belt.hoyer lift ,is available at the home during transfer.One person assistance is provided by the home.we promote safety and assure safety to all of our client,

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

The home will provide assistance when it comes to repositioning.this would depend on clients care plan and assesement this includes:every 2 hours repositioning,roll over,elevating feet ,adjusting pillows,we will make sure that client is free from any skin issues,pressure sore.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

The home provides all types of assistance from monitoring,supervision ,extensive and total when it comes to personal hygiene this would depend on the assesement and care plan .This includes;setting up clients needs,brushing hair,trimming nails,applying lotions,applying deodorants.We encourage client to try to do as much as they could to promote self esteem.

7. DRESSING

The home provides all types of assistance this are monitoring. supervision,extensive,total assistance; that includes as follow:helping client to choose their clothes preferences,giving the right to choose their own clothings helping them to put their clothings,Doing the whole task as needed and base on clients needs when it comes to dressing .We encourage them to do as much as they can but make we make sure that assistance is always there if needed.We respect clients preferences.,

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

The home will provide all types of assistance: monitoring, supervision, extensive, total assistance. This includes doing the whole task, setting up amenities like: preparing bath towels, shampoo, adjusting the temperature of the water, and making sure the clients needs are attained. WE make sure client is free from odor. Clients preferences are observe by the home. We provide shampoo, bath soap, shaving creams, tooth paste.

Medication Services

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation.
