### Personal Care

#### 1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

Prepare meals and assist residents per care plan needs.

#### 2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

We provide supervision, cueing assistance or total assistance for bowel and bladder programs.

#### 3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

We provide stand by assist, curing and monitoring to one person assist.

#### 4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

We assists residents from chairs, beds, showers using gait belt, standby assist or hoyer lift as needed.

#### 5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Residents are repositioned every 2-4 hours. We cueing and monitoring to one person assistance.

#### 6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

We provide partial and total support, as needed per resident.

#### 7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

We assist resident with choosing appropriate clothing, with cueing and monitoring to full assist.

#### 8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

Set up shower, bath, supervision assist with peri-care and total assistance

#### 9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

We personalize the care plan to meet any need the client may have.

### Medication Services

We have experienced care givers, who are nurse delegated, and an RN on call 24/7.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

Blood sugar, insulin administration , eye, ear drops, tube feeding, catheter changing and ostomy care.

- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.
