transfer assistance from cuing and monitoring to one person total assist

5. POSITIONING

positioning assistance from cuing and monitoring to one person total assist

The skilled nursing services are provided by Home Health Services i.e. PT, OT, IV treatment, etc.

medication assistance that includes crushing, blood sugar testing, non-sterile dressing changes, vaginal suppository or cream, topical creams, rectal suppository, breathing treatments (nebulizer, oral inhalation), eye drops/ointments, ear drops, nasal sprays/drops.

Staffing

- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.
