Personal Care

"Personal care services" means both physical assistance and/or prompting and supervising the performance of direct personal care tasks as determined by the resident's needs, and does not include assistance with tasks performed by a licensed health professional. (WAC 388-76-10000)

1. EATING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with eating as follows:

Provide cueing, supervision and 100% assistance with special diet requirements per doctor's orders, monitor for aspiration risk and recording dietary intake of each resident.

2. TOILETING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with toileting as follows:

Provide assistance up to 100% assistance. We will provide cueing and assistance such as supervision, monitoring output for consistency and regularity with one to two person assistance We specialize in managing incontinence of bowel and bladder.

3. WALKING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with walking as follows:

Provide assistance with walking from supervision, verbal cueing to use of assistive devices such as walkers, canes, and wheelchairs accepted.

4. TRANSFERRING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with transferring as follows:

Provide assistance with transferring, from cueing, supervision to who needs assistance, cueing resident's to promote independence and can also help with the use of medical equipment from 1 to 2 person assist. We can help you get in-and-out of bed, chair, toilet, and shower.

5. POSITIONING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with positioning as follows:

Provide assistance with frequent repositioning, provide cueing and supervision with repositioning. We can provide assistance with turning and positioning 24/7.

6. PERSONAL HYGIENE

If needed, the home may provide assistance with personal hygiene as follows:

Provide assistance with personal hygiene from cueing, supervision, set up and up to 100% assistance provided. This includes things like grooming, shaving, and washing assistance.

7. DRESSING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with dressing as follows:

Provide assistance with dressing from cueing to set up to encourage independence and up to 100% assistance provided with dressing, undressing or changing clothing anytime.

8. BATHING

If needed, the home may provide assistance with bathing as follows:

Provide assistance with bathing from cueing, monitoring such as bed bath, shower and up to 100% assistance provided. We provide bating /showering assistance based on your preferences, needs, and care plan.

9. ADDITIONAL COMMENTS REGARDING PERSONAL CARE

Provides medication management and assistance through nurse delegation. Cueing, supervision and also total assistance is provided.

Medication Services

If the home admits residents who need medication assistance or medication administration services by a legally authorized person, the home must have systems in place to ensure the services provided meet the medication needs of each resident and meet all laws and rules relating to medications. The type and amount of medication assistance provided by the home is:

We provide assistance for all oral medication, inhalers, and can be delegated to assist residents with blood glucose monitoring, insulin pens, eye drops, oxygen, and more. up to 100% assistance provided.

Skilled Nursing Services and Nurse Delegation

If the home identifies that a resident has a need for nursing care and the home is not able to provide the care per chapter 18.79 RCW, the home must contract with a nurse currently licensed in the state of Washington to provide the nursing care and service, or hire or contract with a nurse to provide nurse delegation. (WAC 388-76-10405)

The home provides the following skilled nursing services:

Provide basic care and activities of daily living while maintaining and preserving quality of life of the resident.

The home has the ability to provide the following skilled nursing services by delegation:

Medication administration, blood glucose checks, applying ointments, eye drops, simple wound dressing, colostomy, catheter and tube feeding.

Staffing

The home's provider or entity representative must live in the home, or employ or have a contract with a resident manager who lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times. The provider, entity representative, or resident manager is exempt from the requirement to live in the home if the home has 24-hour staffing coverage and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home. (WAC 388-76-10040)

- A resident manager lives in the home and is responsible for the care and services of each resident at all times.
- The provider, entity representative, or resident manager does not live in the home but the home has 24-hour staffing coverage, and a staff person who can make needed decisions is always present in the home.

The normal staffing levels for the home are:
