1099 Providers: Prepare for electronic billing

If you are a Medicaid provider who receives a 1099 tax form from the State of Washington, the way you get paid for Medicaid services is going to change soon.* Today, most payments are processed through the Social Services Payment System (SSPS). In late 2014, you will start using an online system called ProviderOne (detailed dates to be announced). Training will be offered to help you learn how to bill in this new system. It's time to get on board the ProviderOne train. All aboard!

1. STAY INFORMED

2. ACCESS THE RIGHT COMPUTING AND ONLINE TOOLS

To submit bills and get paid through ProviderOne, you will need to use a PC-based computer and have Internet access. As soon as possible, obtain the following tools:

- Internet Explorer 7.0 or higher
- Adobe Acrobat Reader 10.0 or higher
- A valid email address

3. TRACK YOUR DATES OF SERVICE

It's a matter of getting paid. Once you make the transition to ProviderOne you will be reporting your exact dates of service. Make sure you're collecting this information today.
