Agreed Order Proposed

Ecology proposes an agreed order with Welch's Foods for the Welch's Kennewick Plant. The agreed order requires a Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study. The site has petroleum in soil and groundwater. The site is a food processing facility that was formerly owned and operated by Welch Foods, Inc. (Welch's) and is now owned by Lieb Properties II, LLC.

In August 2006, PBS Engineering and Environmental (PBS) conducted a Phase 2 Environmental Assessment. This assessment was the first time petroleum contamination was discovered in soil and groundwater. PBS determined the source of contamination was two 12,000-gallon underground storage tanks that were removed in the 1970s.

PBS excavated the contaminated soil on the site. They submitted two additional reports—a Limited Underground Storage Tank Assessment and a Soil Remedial Action Report—both of which were received by Ecology on August 25, 2006. PBS reported removal of contaminated soil to the depth of the water table, approximately 21 feet. Sampling results from the contaminated soil stockpile confirmed diesel and oil contamination above state cleanup levels. Sampling results from groundwater confirmed

diesel and oil contamination above state cleanup levels.

The RI/FS will document additional sampling data and provide an evaluation of cleanup options. Ecology will oversee the project to ensure that all terms of the Agreed Order are satisfied. After reviewing a State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) environmental checklist, Ecology has made a decision that the RI/FS process will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment.

Availability of Cleanup Action Plan and SEPA Determination

A draft Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) for the Camp Bonneville Military

Reservation Cleanup Site Remedial Action Unit 2A (RAU 2A) is available for public review and comment. Camp Bonneville is located in Clark County, approximately five miles from Vancouver city limits. The CAP describes the proposed cleanup activities for RAU 2A, a portion of the site that includes former small arms firing ranges that are polluted with lead.

The Department of Defense owned and operated Camp Bonneville for firing range practice and training from 1910 to 1995. During that time, military ammunitions such as artillery and mortar ammunition, guided missiles, bombs, and land mines were stored or used at the site. Investigations to characterize site-wide contamination have identified unexploded ordnance, explosive compounds, lead, petroleum products, pesticides and volatile organic compounds in the soil, and perchlorate and explosive chemicals in the groundwater.

Agreed Order for a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study

Ecology proposes to enter into an Agreed Order with Milton's Dry Cleaners to complete a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study at the Milton's Dry Cleaner site in Vancouver.

Contamination resulted from a dry cleaning business that operated at the site from 1969 until 2001. Investigations detected Perchloroethylene (PCE) levels above MTCA cleanup levels in both soil and groundwater. A site hazard assessment was done in 1998 and the site received a hazard ranking of 2. A rank of "1" is the highest level of environmental concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of "5" is the lowest. Interim cleanup actions have been completed at the site, including the removal of impacted soils.

The Agreed Order would require Milton's Dry Cleaners to conduct a Remedial investigation (RI) to determine the nature and extent of contamination on site and complete a Feasibility study (FS) to develop and evaluate cleanup alternatives.

Agreed Order for Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study and Interim Actions and SEPA Determination are Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology and Support Terminals Services (ST Services) are entering into an Agreed Order to complete a Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study and Interim Actions at the NuStar Energy L.P. site in Vancouver. Initial investigations discovered several contaminants above the Model Toxics Cleanup Act (MTCA) cleanup levels, including the chlorinated solvents perchloroethene (PCE) and trichloroethylene (TCE). The site has been, and is currently, used as a ship terminal and bulk liquid receiving and storage facility. Contamination to soil and groundwater occurred prior to 1998.

In 1998, ST Services purchased the site and entered into an Agreed Order with Ecology to complete a Remedial Investigation, Feasibility Study and Interim Actions. Before these activities could be completed, the parent company of ST Services was purchased by Valero L.P. Valero recently changed its name to NuStar Energy L.P.

The Agreed Order would require ST Services to do the following:

- Complete the Remedial Investigation of the site.
- Take Interim Actions to reduce contamination and risk to human health and the environment.

- Complete a Feasibility Study to identify and evaluate cleanup remedies.

Agreed Order

An Agreed Order and associated Public Participation Plan for the Chevron Tank Farm Port Washington Narrows site in Bremerton, WA are available for public comment. The Agreed Order requires the City of Bremerton to conduct a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study (RI/FS), develop a Cleanup Action Plan, and conduct an interim action to remove sources of petroleum contamination on the site. A Public Participation Plan is also required for the site. Total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH), benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and xylene

(BTEX) concentrations have exceeded Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) cleanup levels in site groundwater. TPH, benzene, toluene, and xylene concentrations have exceeded MTCA cleanup levels in site soil. TPH, xylene, and lead have been detected in marine sediments. The site was used historically for bulk petroleum storage and distribution between approximately 1950 and 1988, and is currently vacant property.

An Agreed Order for the Port of Anacortes Dakota Creek site in Anacortes, WA is available for public comment. The Agreed Order requires the Port of Anacortes to conduct a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study

(RI/FS) and to develop a Cleanup Action Plan and Public Participation Plan for the site.

Total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH), polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), and arsenic concentrations have exceeded Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) soil cleanup levels at the site and were subject to interim action in 2002. Arsenic concentrations exceed MTCA cleanup levels in groundwater; and metals, PAHs, bis (2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP), and dibenzofurans exceed Sediment Quality Standards in sediments.

The site has been used for vessel moorage, shipbuilding, and bulk fuel and oil storage and distribution since 1879. Dakota Creek Industries, Inc. currently uses the site as a shipyard for construction and repair.

Periodic Review Available to the Public

Ecology invites the public to review and comment on a periodic review of the Greenacres Landfill site. A periodic review is conducted at least every five years after the initiation of a cleanup

action, as required by the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA). The purpose of the review is to evaluate site conditions and monitoring data, after cleanup is considered complete, and to ensure human health and the environment is protected.

The Greenacres Landfill site is located about 14 miles east of Spokane, in the city of Liberty Lake in a former ravine that merges with the Spokane Valley to the north. The landfill property covers nearly 58 acres and served as a dump until closure in 1972. Now, property adjacent to the landfill is a newly developed residential neighborhood.

The Spokane-Rathdrum Prairie Aquifer, a “sole source aquifer” lies under the Spokane Valley north of the site. The aquifer provides drinking water for nearly 500,000 people. Groundwater contamination was discovered in a residential well downgradient from the site in 1978. The contamination included volatile and semi-volatile organic compounds and metals. After additional groundwater monitoring and studies, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency listed the landfill as a Superfund site in 1984.

Several additional studies were completed and a cleanup action was implemented. Institutional controls including a restrictive covenant were placed on the landfill and property downgradient of the site: Restrictions include: no withdrawal of water; maintenance of fences and locked gates; no site access except for operations and maintenance and no actions that may cause a release or create an exposure pathway.

Ecology has determined the following cleanup actions at the site provide protection for human health and the environment.

- The cover system placed over the landfill eliminates direct contact with refuse and soil contamination.
- The gas management system

eliminates gas migration beyond the landfill and potential vapor transport to groundwater.

- The stormwater system manages potential water run off.
- Groundwater contamination is reduced.
- The restrictive covenant on the property remains in place.
- Compliance monitoring continues until Ecology determines it is no longer necessary.

Proposed Delisting from Hazardous Sites List

Ecology is proposing to remove the Naches Valley Intermediate School (Site) located at 101 Shafer Avenue in Naches, from the Hazardous Sites List. The Site is currently ranked a 5 on the list. Sites can be ranked from “1” to “5”. A rank of “1” is the highest level of environmental concern compared to other sites on the list, and a rank of “5” is the lowest.

As former old orchard, the Site was subjected to historical pesticide applications. Lead arsenate was widely used to control the codling moth prior to 1950. Unfortunately, it resulted in lead and arsenic contamination at many former orchards throughout central Washington.

In 2005, Ecology staff tested the soil at the Site and found lead and arsenic contamination exceeding state cleanup levels.

During the summer of 2006, Ecology staff managed a cleanup at the Site designed to reduce or eliminate the lead and arsenic contamination.

It involved two major steps: 1) excavation of contaminated soil for disposal at a permitted landfill, and 2) deep mixing of residual soil to reduce contamination levels. Once these steps were complete, clean topsoil was imported. New seed or sod was placed down to establish grass.

Ecology staff verified through confirmational sampling that the contamination had been either removed or reduced to below state cleanup levels. Therefore, Ecology proposes removing the Site from the Hazardous Sites list. It no longer poses a threat to human health and the environment.

After review, Ecology sends a letter to the property owner stating either that additional work is required to be removed from the list of hazardous waste sites or that no further action is needed.

VOLUNTARY CLEANUP PROGRAM

Under Ecology's Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), a property owner cleaning up a contaminated site pays a fee for Ecology review. When a cleanup is determined to be sufficient, Ecology issues a no further action decision.
