

Department of Ecology to Hold Reclaimed Water Workshop in Olympia

Department of Ecology (Ecology) is hosting a Reclaimed Water Workshop to discuss permitting of existing reclaimed water facilities and facilities in the planning stage to illustrate how Ecology will implement its draft reclaimed water rule through permits. Specifically, Ecology will use case studies to illustrate:

- How Ecology determines reclaimed water permit conditions.
- How Ecology chooses specific monitoring parameters.
- How Ecology applies anti-degradation provisions.
- How the Overriding Consideration of Public Interest (OCPI) may apply to a project.
- How Ecology determines compliance points for monitoring requirements.

Tentative schedule moving forward

Sept. 24: Ecology receives comments from Rule Advisory Committee (RAC) members on draft of reclaimed water guidance.

Early November: Ecology provides second draft of reclaimed water guidance, revised draft rule language, and Small Business Economic Impact Statement and Cost Benefit Analysis and Least Burdensome Alternatives Analysis to RAC members.

Early December: Ecology files draft rule with state Code Revisers Office and begins public comment period.
