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## INTRODUCTION

The Washington State Department of Ecology's Nuclear Waste Program (Ecology) manages dangerous waste within the state by writing permits to regulate its treatment, storage, and disposal. When a new permit or a significant modification to an existing permit is proposed, Ecology holds a public comment period to allow the public to review the change and provide formal feedback. (See [Washington Administrative Code \[WAC\] 173-303-830](#) for types of permit changes.)

This Response to Comments is the last step before issuing the final permit, and its purpose is to:

- Specify which provisions, if any, of a permit will become effective upon issuance of the final permit, providing reasons for those changes.
- Describe and document public involvement actions.
- List and respond to all significant comments received during the public comment period and any related public hearings.

## REASONS FOR MODIFYING THE PERMIT

### **Annual Groundwater Report History**

In 2009, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Ecology, and the United States Department of Energy (USDOE) discussed the Annual Groundwater Report (Report) format. EPA and Ecology significantly modified the Report format and content through Hanford's Cleanup Constraints Challenges Team (C3T) process, with participation from the state of Oregon and Tribal Nations.

Some major changes came out of that review process:

1. The Report had been issued for a federal fiscal year, which runs from October 1 to September 30. The term of the Report was changed to cover a calendar year, which matches the [WAC 173-303-390](#) annual schedule for groundwater monitoring data.

2. The Report was changed to include all data from Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA), Atomic Energy Act, and other miscellaneous project groundwater monitoring programs. This created a combined annual report of all yearly groundwater data. Only the RCRA portion of the Report has a required due date, which is March 1.

The final data for a calendar year are available in January or February of the next year. That data must then be analyzed and evaluated before the draft Report is produced, which takes at least four months in the next calendar year. The draft is then provided to the regulatory agencies (Ecology and EPA) for review.

The current report is more than 1,000 pages and contains information on four major groundwater units in Hanford's Central Plateau, multiple groundwater units along the Columbia River, and numerous soil sites and facilities that have had leaks to the environment. This yields a report that is much more complex than the regulations likely envisioned. History has shown that USDOE cannot obtain and analyze data, then write a report on all these units and sites in three months.

USDOE has had to request due date extension each year since agreeing to prepare a combined report (2010 through 2014). When the last extension was granted in 2014, Ecology decided to modify the Permit to allow USDOE more time to prepare and issue this Report.

## **Permit Conditions and Attachment 9 Descriptions**

### **Change to Permit Condition II.F.2.a.**

This permit condition addresses inspection of resource protection wells.

Permit Condition II.F.2.a cited an incorrect portion of [WAC 173-160](#), *Minimum Standards for Construction and Maintenance of Wells*. The error was noted as part of a routine Ecology inspection of the U.S. Department of Energy Groundwater Monitoring Program. The regulatory citation has been corrected. This permit condition must also be corrected in Attachment 9.

### **Addition of Permit Condition II.F.4.**

This permit condition addresses the Annual Groundwater Report due date.

Historically, Hanford groundwater monitoring data was reported in many different formats. In 2009, Ecology, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the state of Oregon, and Tribal Nations held discussions on the reporting of groundwater monitoring data. As a result, it was determined that a combined report of all the data collected in a calendar year would be the most efficient and consistent way to address the data needs of all interested parties.

The U.S. Department of Energy (the permittee) is required to submit the combined report to Ecology on March 1 of each year. Producing a report of this size requires more time than the current deadline in the regulations allows. As a result, Ecology is adding Permit Condition II.F to extend the annual deadline for submitting this report from the current due date of March 1 to July 31. This condition must also be added to Attachment 9.

**Change in Attachment 9 - Permit Applicability Matrix.** The Permit Applicability Matrix is being updated to include the new permit condition II.F.4 and to correct a missing notation for existing Permit Condition II.F.2.a.

## **PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT ACTIONS**

Ecology invited public comment on the Part II Permit Conditions and Attachment 9 Permit Applicability Matrix changes during a 45-day public comment period held from December 28, 2015, through February 13, 2016.

We took the following actions to inform the public:

- Mailed a public notice announcing the comment period to about 1,700 people subscribed to the Hanford postal mailing list.
- Placed a public announcement legal classified advertisement in the *Tri-City Herald* on December 27, 2015.
- Sent a notice announcing the start of the comment period to the [Hanford-Info email list](#), which has about 1,500 recipients.

## RESPONSE TO COMMENTS

### Description of Comments:

Ecology accepted comments on the Part II Permit Conditions and Attachment 9 Permit Applicability Matrix from December 28, 2015, through February 13, 2016. This section provides summary of comments that we received during the public comment period and our responses, as required by the [Revised Code of Washington \(RCW\) 34.05.325\(6\)\(a\)\(iii\)](#).

Comments are grouped by individual and each comment is addressed separately. Ecology's responses directly follow each comment in italic font. Verbatim copies of all written comments are attached in Appendix B.

### **Comment #1 from Judy Pigott, Citizen, dated January 4, 2016**

*Changes to Part II Permit Conditions and Attachment 9 of the Hanford Site-wide Permit: The difficulties here were known before. This seems intended to add another delay. Instead of doing as proposed, add resources to the current plan and move forward.*

### **Ecology Response:**

*As cleanup work has progressed at Hanford, the scope of the annual groundwater report has grown. There are monitoring programs for the CERCLA, the RCRA, the Atomic Energy Act, and various other project and remediation technologies. The best use of USDOE and contractor resources is to produce a comprehensive report of all groundwater data generated during a calendar year. This allows all the regulators and interested parties to have access to all the data in one report.*

*It is a benefit to all programs generating groundwater data to see the full set of data. Ecology recognizes the difficulties in producing a report of this size in two months (from January 1 to February 28 of each following year). Only the RCRA portion of the report has an annual due date of March 1.*

*Rather than waste time and resources continuing to allow for extensions to the due date for one portion of the report (RCRA), Ecology has chosen to allow enough time for a complete report. All parties that use this data want access to a comprehensive report. Use of all available data to make cleanup decisions is cost-effective and uses sound judgment.*

### **Comment #2 from Mike Conlan, Citizen, February 13, 2016**

- 1) Remove all nuclear waste,
- 2) Do not allow anymore nuclear waste into the facility,
- 3) Replace all the single storage tanks,
- 4) Stop all the nuclear leakage entering the Columbia River.

### **Ecology Response:**

*Ecology is working to ensure that long-term storage, treatment, and disposal of the waste is protective of human health and the environment. The proposed permit changes are not to allow*

*new waste; the changes are to allow for better management and availability of the groundwater monitoring data collected at Hanford.*

*Single-shell tanks are not in the scope of this comment period. Ecology agrees that the tanks pose a threat. We believe a better approach to addressing it is to remove the waste from the single-shell tanks and put it in the compliant double-shell tanks to prepare for eventual treatment in the Waste Treatment Plant now being built.*

*Stopping any potential nuclear waste from impacting the Columbia River is not within the scope of this comment period. Prevention of groundwater and surface water impacts are addressed in operations associated with other units.*

## Changes to Part II Permit Conditions and Attachment 9 of the Hanford Site-wide Permit

Washington's Department of Ecology (Ecology) invites you to comment on a proposed change to Hanford's dangerous waste permit, also known as the Hanford Site-wide Permit. The change is to modify and add Part II permit conditions. These changes will also be reflected in Attachment 9 of the Hanford Site-wide Permit.

### Resource Protection Well Permit Condition Modified

Permit Condition II.F.2.a. addresses inspection of resource protection wells. The permit condition cited an incorrect portion of WAC 173-160, *Minimum Standards for Construction and Maintenance of Wells*. The error was noted as part of a routine Ecology inspection of the U.S. Department of Energy (USDOE) Groundwater Monitoring Program. The regulatory citation has been corrected. This permit condition must also be corrected in Attachment 9.

### Groundwater Monitoring Report Due Date Extended

Historically, groundwater monitoring data was reported in many different formats. In 2009, discussions between Ecology, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, the state of Oregon, and the Tribal Nations determined that a combined report of all the data collected in a calendar year would be the most efficient and consistent way to address the data needs of all interested parties.

USDOE (the permittee) is required to submit a report of all groundwater monitoring results annually to Ecology. Producing a report of this size requires more time than the current deadline in the regulations allows. As a result, Ecology is proposing to add a permit condition to extend the annual deadline for submitting this report from the current due date of March 1 to July 31. This condition must also be added to Attachment 9.

### WHY IT MATTERS

At the Department of Ecology Nuclear Waste Program, we work to make sure Hanford's cleanup follows our state's regulations to protect our air, land, water, and citizens.

It is important that permit conditions are accurate and allow compliance with the regulations.

We invite you to comment on this permit modification before we make our decision.

The RCRA portion of the annual groundwater report is due by March 1 of each year per WAC 173-303-390. The final data for a calendar year are available in January or February of the next year. Analysis of yearly data and the write-up of the evaluation of data takes at least four months in the next calendar year to produce a draft Report. The Report is then provided to the regulatory agencies for review. The current report is over 1,000 pages and contains information on four major groundwater units in the Central Plateau, multiple groundwater units along the Columbia River, and numerous soil sites and facilities that have had leaks to the environment. This yields a report that is much more complex than the regulations probably envisioned. Past history has shown that USDOE cannot obtain and analyze data, then write a report on all these units and sites in three months.
