Availability of RI/FS Reports and Draft and Final Cleanup Plans

A draft Remedial Investigation report (RI) for the uplands environment of the Rayonier Port Angeles Mill is available for public review and comment. The RI describes the nature and extent of contamination for the site. The site has dioxins, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, petroleum and metals in soil and groundwater. Rayonier operated a specialty pulp mill on this property from the 1930s to 1997.

Ecology is holding a **public meeting** about the draft RI. The meeting will be held in the **Clallam County Commissioners Board Room, 223 East Fourth Street, Port Angeles, on November 8, 2006 from 7:00pm to 9:00pm**. An open house at 5:00pm will be followed by the public meeting.

Moses Lake Wellfield Contamination Superfund Site, Moses Lake

Draft Consent Decree Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology and the City of Moses Lake (City) have negotiated this draft Consent Decree to provide oversight to the cleanup at Moses Lake. The City has agreed to reimburse some of Ecology's past costs.

The site includes at least one plume of trichloroethylene (TCE) contaminated groundwater within an area at least a mile wide, up to three miles long, and from 100 to 310 feet deep, underlying and extending south from the former Larson Air Force Base.

The U.S. Air Force used the base from 1942 until the mid 1960s, when it was decommissioned and sold. Currently, the Port of Moses Lake owns most of the land, operating part of it as Grant County International Airport.

During groundwater sampling by the Washington Department of Health in 1988 and 1989, elevated TCE levels were found in some of the Moses Lake

municipal wells at the former base and in the two Skyline water systems wells. The City protected municipal water systems users by either closing the contaminated municipal wells or sealing off the shallow contaminated basalt aquifers.

Recycled Aluminum Metals Company (RAMCO), Port of Klickitat Industrial Park, east of Dallesport

Interim Remedial Action Plan

Ecology is providing the opportunity for the public to comment on its plans to clean up buried aluminum waste at the Port of Klickitat Industrial Park. The Industrial Park is located approximately two miles east of Dallesport, Washington. The site of the proposed cleanup is about 400 feet southwest of Spearfish Lake and about 1000 feet north of Lake Celilo (the name of the portion of the Columbia River that is backed up behind The Dalles Dam). The two documents prepared for public comment are the Interim Remedial Action Plan and SEPA Determination of Non-Significance (DNS).

From approximately 1982 until 1993 RAMCO took in material from aluminum smelters, then extracted residual aluminum from this material. The extraction process resulted in wastes being generated. One solid waste was called salt cake. A second type of solid waste consisted of captured airborne waste and was called bag house dust. From approximately 1982 to 1989, these wastes were buried in the unlined disposal site. This is the area Ecology proposes to clean up. In the final years RAMCO extracted aluminum, the wastes produced were shipped off-site, initially to North Wasco County Landfill and then to Roosevelt Regional Landfill.

Ecology conducted groundwater sampling in the area proposed for cleanup. Sampling results show levels of major salt-forming chemical elements (sodium, calcium, potassium) are greater than levels of these elements found in seawater. This indicates salts from the salt cake waste have found their way into nearby groundwater. Ecology is also concerned that metals contamination from the aluminum waste could be a concern, but groundwater monitoring so far has not confirmed that. The waste material, when disposed, produces ammonia gas when wet. The odor of ammonia was detected during groundwater sampling events.

Ecology has considered several options for cleanup. The option preferred by Ecology is excavating the waste and hauling it by truck or rail transportation to a landfill for disposal.

Depending on the availability of funding the project could be completed in one year or it may take two or more phases extending over several years.

After reviewing a State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) environmental checklist, Ecology has made a decision that the cleanup will not have a significant negative impact on the environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required. The checklist is part of the

documents available for public comment.

UST Settlement Agreement

Ecology proposes to enter into an Underground Storage Tank Settlement Agreement with Gagandeep Bains and Bains LLC.

In August 2003, Ecology completed an Underground Storage Tank (UST) compliance inspection of the Flying B #1 gas station located in Okanogan County. During the inspection, several violations of the UST regulations were found. In October 2003, Ecology issued Notice of Penalty (Penalty) in the amount of \$87,100 for the violations. An Application for Relief of Penalty was filed with Ecology in October 2003. In November 2003, Ecology issued a Notice affirming the Penalty.

In December 2003, an appeal of the Penalty was filed with the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB). In February 2005, Ecology and Mr. Gagandeep Bains, an owner in Bains LLC, entered into Stipulation and Agreed Order of Dismissal for PCHB case No. 03-161 (PCHB Settlement Agreement) which was presented to the PCHB. Based on the PCHB Settlement Agreement, the PCHB dismissed No. 03-161. In June 2006, Ecology commenced this action by filing a Summons and Complaint for Breach of Settlement Agreement and to Recover Unpaid Penalty (Complaint). On September 18, 2006, Ecology filed Plaintiffs Motion for Default Against Defendants and Plaintiffs Motion for Default Judgment to Recover Unpaid Penalty.

Ecology and the Defendants have agreed to resolve this dispute through a proposed Settlement Agreement. The Agreement settles all issues raised by the Complaint. Ecology agrees to deem Penalty No. DE 03TCPCR-5793 and the PCHB Settlement Agreement satisfied upon Defendants' satisfactory and timely completion of its obligations under this Agreement. Ecology agrees to lower Defendants' obligation to pay \$9,000 under the PCHB Settlement Agreement to \$7,500 in recognition of Mr. Bains' completion of operator training, which was required under the PCHB Settlement Agreement. In order to satisfy the remaining \$7,500 obligation, Defendants agree to make 12 monthly payments in the amount of \$625. If Defendants fail to make any scheduled monthly payment, the full amount of \$9,000 will become due and payable immediately.

Agreed Order, Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study

Ecology and Federal Asset Recovery (FAR) propose to enter into an Agreed Order. FAR will summarize existing environmental information about the Dock Street site, determine if additional remedial investigations are necessary, develop a work plan and complete additional investigations if needed. The order further requires FAR to conduct a feasibility study and develop a draft cleanup action plan if contaminants are found to be remaining on the site.

The site is located on the west shoreline of Thea Foss Waterway, which is included within the Commencement Bay Nearshore/Tideflats Federal Superfund site. It was formerly operated as the Consumers Central Heating Plant, providing steam heat to downtown Tacoma. In 1996, Ecology conducted an interim action at the site to remove fill material containing mercury from the site shoreline. The interim action was performed as a measure to control sources of pollution to Thea Foss Waterway in advance of the Superfund sediment remediation in that waterway.

The Agreed Order includes provisions for FAR to repay Ecology's costs of the 1996 interim action.

Agreed Order to conduct Remedial Investigation and Cleanup

Ecology and Abitibi Consolidated Sales Corporation (Abitibi) have agreed to a Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA, Chapter 70.105D RCW) order to perform a remedial investigation and cleanup of contaminated soils and groundwater at the site. The agreed order is a legal document agreed to between Ecology and potentially liable persons (PLPs), to ensure that proposed activities are conducted in a timely way, in agreement with MTCA and other applicable laws and regulations.

The facility has historically been operated as a lumber mill and paper manufacturing mill. Abitibi acquired the facility in January 1998 from Stone Consolidated. Other owners had operated the mill since 1919. The presence of the contaminants at the facility appears to have predated Abitibi's ownership, based on documentation Abitibi provided. Abitibi operated the facility until December 2000. The facility has been shut down since that time.

Investigations conducted by the company on its property have documented the presence of petroleum hydrocarbons and benzene in soil and groundwater, and arsenic in the groundwater, on the property. These contaminants are currently the chemicals of concern (COCs) for the Site. Investigations include a Phase I Environmental Site Assessment, dated January 2001; a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment, dated May 2005; a soil and groundwater field investigation, dated July 2005; and additional soil and groundwater characterization performed in February 2006. The soil and groundwater investigations found COCs above MTCA Method A standards in both soils and groundwater.

Abitibi first proposed to enter the Ecology Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) to get Ecology review of remedial investigation and cleanup work done at the site. Ecology made a determination that the nature of the site, its location adjacent to surface water, and the complexity of the site made it a poor candidate for the VCP and informed Abitibi that the work would have to be done under an Ecology Agreed Order. Because Abitibi had anticipated going under the VCP, much of the work on the site had already been done prior to entering into negotiations with Ecology for the agreed order. Ecology reviewed the documentation of work performed up to that time and approved further work to be done before the agreed order would be in effect. Remedial actions are continuing at the site at this time.

Supplemental Remedial Investigation/ Feasibility Study and Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement Available for Public Review and Comment – Whatcom Waterway site, Bellingham

Ecology is seeking public comment on a draft Supplemental Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS) and a companion draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Whatcom Waterway site (Site) in Bellingham, WA. The Supplemental RI/FS incorporates the results of environmental investigations conducted since completion of the original RI/FS in 2000, updates previously evaluated cleanup alternatives, describes and evaluates new cleanup alternatives that reflect changes in land use, and identifies a preferred cleanup approach. The EIS supplements the original impact analysis completed in 2000 and evaluates the environmental impacts, benefits and potential mitigation actions associated with the updated and new cleanup alternatives for the Site.

The Site includes aquatic lands adjacent to Georgia Pacific's (G-P) former pulp mill and chlor/alkali plant in downtown Bellingham. In 1965, G-P constructed a chlor/alkali plant at the mill complex to produce chlorine and sodium hydroxide for use in bleaching and pulping wood fiber. The chlor/alkali plant discharged mercury-laden wastewater directly into an area of Bellingham Bay known as the Whatcom Waterway.

Environmental investigations of the Site have confirmed the presence of mercury

and several contaminants associated with wood materials at concentrations exceeding standards under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) and Washington Sediment Management Standards. As a result, the Site is subject to investigation and cleanup requirements of MTCA.

Consent Decree

Ecology proposes a consent decree with Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad for the Bay Chemical Site. The consent decree requires the excavation and on-site consolidation and capping of soils contaminated with heavy metals. The site

covers approximately 52 acres owned by the BNSF and Roche family. From 1963 to 1976, operations conducted by the Bay Chemical Company on property leased from BNSF resulted in releases of hazardous substances to the soil and groundwater. The primary contaminants of concern at the site are metals released during Bay Chemical's manufacturing process and include antimony, arsenic, cadmium, chromium, copper, lead, manganese, mercury, and zinc. Ecology (as SEPA lead agency) has determined that the proposed actions will not have a probable adverse impact on the environment. As a result, Ecology proposes to issue a determination of non-significance (DNS) under the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA, chapter 197-11 WAC) Rules.
