Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) and State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) Checklist for Underground Storage Tank Removals Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology is providing an opportunity for the public to comment on a Determination of Non-Significance (DNS) and State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) checklist for the removal of seven underground storage tanks from the Ken Harrison Texaco site.

The property has been the site of several gas stations from as early as the 1930s. The current station, Harrison Texaco, was constructed in 1965. It has not been used as service station for 10 years and is now occupied by J.K. Log Furniture.

Ecology plans to dig out the seven underground storage tanks over a two week period. The tanks will be removed and replaced with clean soil. Soils that may be polluted with gasoline, diesel, waste oil, or petroleum breakdown products will be properly disposed of off-site.

This work will be done in a way that causes the least disruption to businesses and the community.

- Work will be done during daylight hours.
- A state certified tank decommissioner will oversee the work.

- Polluted soil will be fenced off and covered until it can be taken for proper disposal.

The SEPA checklist describes the project's potential impact on the surrounding environment and local community. Ecology reviewed this checklist and determined that the cleanup will probably not cause harm to the environment or local community. Ecology requests comments on a proposed consent decree in United States v. Glacier Northwest, Inc (lodged with the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington). Past releases of hazardous substances to the environment have injured natural resources in the Hylebos Waterway of Commencement Bay, Washington. The consent decree requires Glacier

Northwest, Inc. to pay Commencement Bay Natural Resource Trustees for its share of those damages. The trustees are the State of Washington, the Puyallup Tribe of Indians, the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration of the United States Department of Commerce, and the United States Department of the Interior. Glacier Northwest, Inc will pay \$208,316.24 for natural resource damages and assessment costs.

Proposed Consent Decree

Ecology requests comments on a proposed consent decree in United States v. Streich Bros., Inc. (lodged with the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington). Past releases of hazardous substances to the environment have injured natural resources in the Hylebos Waterway of Commencement Bay, Washington. The consent decree requires Streich Bros., Inc. to pay Commencement Bay Natural Resource Trustees for its share of those damages. The trustees are the State of Washington, the Puyallup Tribe of Indians, the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric

Administration of the United States Department of Commerce, and the United States Department of the Interior. Streich Bros., Inc. will pay \$202,137.15 for natural resource damages and assessment costs.

Consent Decree Amendment and Site-Specific Cleanup Action Plan (SCAP) Available for Public Review and Comment

Ecology is providing opportunity for the public to comment on an amendment to Consent Decree No. 94-2-10917-6, which includes a Site-Specific Cleanup Action Plan (SCAP) for the Tacoma Redevelopment Properties - Dock Street North Right of Way (ROW) site. Ecology is issuing this Order through the Model Toxics Control Act (Chapter 70.105D RCW, Chapter 173-340 WAC).

The Dock Street North ROW site includes the paved street area from South 15th Street to about 470 feet north of South 11th Street, and two other areas:

- A triangular-shaped area west of Dock Street and just north of East 15th Street; and

- A portion extending about 200 feet south of South 15th Street.

The site was originally tidelands, before being filled in during the late 1800's for use as a road and railway. Transportation is the only known historic use of Dock Street North ROW. The site is currently contaminated with arsenic, benzene, carcinogenic polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (cPAHs), and petroleum hydrocarbons. These chemicals probably came mainly from contamination in the fill used to create the street. Other possible sources include:

- An abandoned coal gas supply line.
- An underground storage tank removed in 2000.
- An abandoned steam line removed during the cleanup of Dock Street South ROW.

Once the SCAP is finalized, a draft Engineering Design Report, construction plans, and monitoring and maintenance plans will be submitted to Ecology. Cleanup and construction efforts should begin in March of 2007.

Nasty Jack's Antiques site, 103 East Morris Street, La Conner

Proposed Delisting from Hazardous Sites List Available for Public Review & Comment

Ecology is proposing to remove Nasty Jack's Antiques site from its Hazardous Site List. This site is ranked "2" on the list (a rank of "1" represents the highest level of risk compared to other sites, and a rank of "5" represents the lowest).

On this property there is a retail antique shop, chemical storage shed, furniture refinishing facility, and a parking lot. Nasty Jacks furniture refinishing involved adding stripping compound to loosen the original finish on the furniture until it was bare wood. Once the stripping process was completed, the furniture pieces were taken outside the building to the outdoor washing and wipe down area where they were washed down with water.

As a result of these activities at the site, investigations showed that the soil near the outdoor washing and wipe down area was contaminated with the residue from the stripping process. Soil and surface water were contaminated with methylene chloride, ethylbenzene, toluene, and xylene. In April 1991, this site was listed on the State database for Confirmed and Suspected Contaminated Site List.

In February 2006, the owners entered an agreement with Ecology under the Voluntary Cleanup Program. In order to contain the hazardous soil on the gravel parking lot, the entire parking lot was filled with 2 inches of thick asphalt. The contaminants were confined to the property area and a restrictive covenant was placed on this property. Paving the parking lot and having a restrictive covenant reduced the threat of further exposure to or migration of contaminated materials, and protects human health and the environment.

Ecology has determined this site no longer poses a threat to human health and the environment and is proposing to remove the site from its Hazardous Sites List.

The cleanup and the new furniture refinishing process no longer affects the surface water and shallow groundwater. If the site is removed from the Hazardous Sites List, it will also be removed from the Confirmed and Suspected Contaminated Sites List. On November 15, 2006, Ecology issued a No Future Action Letter with a restrictive covenant (a deed restriction) not to modify the asphalt area.

Ecology invites public comment on several documents related to a proposed Interim Action:

The Cap Sante Marine site is owned by the Port of Anacortes (Port). It has been operated as a boat yard and marina support area since 1959. In the early 1980s, fuel was observed seeping from an underground storage tank (UST) into the waters of Fidalgo Bay next to the site. Fuel was recovered and the seepage was stopped. In 1985, the Port replaced the then-existing USTs with new tanks; however, impacted soils linked to the prior petroleum leakage were not removed.

In 2004 and 2005, the Port further inspected the degree of site contamination. Findings revealed that a fan-shaped contaminated area around the former USTs extending to the bay was impacting soil and groundwater. The Port will remove the USTs and any contaminated soils. The site will be monitored to check the cleanup action.

When a property owner applies to Ecology for review of their independent cleanup, the site enters the Voluntary Cleanup Program. After review, Ecology sends a letter to the property owner stating either that additional work is required to be removed from the list of hazardous waste sites or that no further action is needed.
