

General Regulations for Air Pollution Sources, Chapter 173-400 WAC

The Washington State Department of Ecology has updated its rule that regulates industrial sources of air pollutants (Chapter 173-400 WAC, General Regulations for Air Pollution Sources).

What is Chapter 173-400 WAC?

This is Ecology's rule for regulating criteria pollutants and toxic air pollutants emitted by industrial sources.

Criteria pollutants

Criteria pollutants are air pollutants for which the federal government sets health-based standards. Regulated criteria pollutants are:

- carbon monoxide (CO),
- particulate matter,
- ozone (O₃)
- sulfur dioxide (SO₂),
- lead (Pb), and
- nitrogen dioxide (NO₂).

Toxic air pollutants

The listing of toxic air pollutants is found in Chapter 173-460 WAC, Controls for New Sources of Toxic Air Pollutants.

Examples of toxic air pollutants include benzene from gasoline and heavy metals.

Summary of the rule changes adopted on March 1, 2011

The changes:

- Bring the rule into compliance with United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations including standards for excess emissions, major stationary sources located in a nonattainment area, and update the date of federal regulations adopted by reference.

WHY IT MATTERS

Chapter 173-400 WAC is a major part of Washington's efforts to meet federal air quality standards and protect health. The rule changes contain new elements that regulate new pollution sources and modified major pollution sources in nonattainment areas (specific areas in the state where air quality does not meet federal air quality standards). The rule changes support programs to bring those areas into attainment.

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- Set a new exemption level for greenhouse gas emissions and particulate matter, PM2.5, below which permitting is not required.
- Create a program allowing inter-jurisdictional recognition of permits for portable sources.
- Keep the rule correlated with recent updates to related WAC.
- Update definitions to match current state and federal regulations.
- Clarify the permitting program for non-road engines.
- Establish a permitting procedure for emergency engines.
- Update the rule to resolve State Implementation Plan deficiencies.
- And other housekeeping corrections and changes.

Response to comments

It affects a broad range of industries and facilities, including commercial and industrial businesses that emit criteria pollutants and toxic air pollutants as defined in Chapter 173-400 WAC and Chapter 173-460 WAC.
