Opportunity to comment

The Department of Ecology invites you to comment on Notice of Construction (NOC) Order No. 8429 for Longview Fibre Paper and Packaging, Inc.

We will accept comments by mail, fax or e-mail April 8, 2011 – May 16, 2011. A public meeting to share information and answer questions, followed by a hearing to accept formal comments will take place:

Date: May 10, 2011

Time: Starting at 6:30 p.m.

Location: Lower Columbia College, Student Center conference rooms A and B, 1600 Maple Street, Longview, WA

Proposed order

The proposed order allows the mill to make the following modifications:

- Upgrades to power boiler #20, including efficiency improvements to produce more steam from wood fuel and installing a selective non-catalytic reduction (SNCR) system to control nitrogen oxides emissions. The mill will burn the same or less woody fuel and less fossil fuel than it does currently.
- Modifying recovery furnace #19, including a more efficient electrostatic precipitator (ESP) to control particulate emissions and conversion to a low odor non-direct contact evaporation (NCDE) concentrator system.
- Installing a new heavy black liquor solids tank to support furnace #19 conversion.
- Modifying the recovery furnace #22 heat exchange system.
- Modifying lime kiln #5 and lime slaker #6 to increase capacity.
- Installing new steam turbine capacity and supporting cooling tower.

- Permanently shutting down power boilers #12 and #13, recovery furnace #18, and smelt dissolving tank #18.

These modifications will allow the mill to produce up to 54.22 MW of additional electricity. The proposed order includes emission limits and other requirements the mill must meet. The Title 5 Air Operating Permit will be modified at a later date to include the new requirements.

Facility description

The mill is located at 300 Fibre Way near Longview and began operation in 1927. Products include bag, kraft, wrapping and specialty papers and containerboard. The mill employs about 1,000 people and average production is approximately 3,000 tons per day.
