*for Middle and High School science, social studies,  
and health classes, and after-school programs*

Teens are a primary target for sale of personal care products – yet some ingredients used to make cosmetics, lotion, deodorant, shampoo, and hair dye have been linked to cancer and may cause reproductive and environmental harm. Join us for a 55 or 75-minute presentation on toxins in personal care products and alternatives teens can choose to protect themselves. We'll learn about health concerns, how to read labels, helpful websites, and safer alternatives. The students will make an all-natural lip balm to take home, to remind them they can keep looking and smelling good without toxic products! We request groups of 10 to 30 students and are happy to schedule multiple presentations to accommodate everyone.

## Hazards on the Homefront

*for Middle and High School science, social studies,

A fast-paced bingo game teaches students about alternative products and an experiment comparing cleaners lets students determine first-hand whether less-toxic products are effective!
