



# Drop-Off Recycling

## Newspaper Bin These items only



- Newspaper and inserts

- NO mixed paper
- NO paper bags or plastic bags
- Keep dry
- Do not tie and bundle

## Glass Bin

These items only  
(Labels okay • Rinse • Discard lids)



- Bottles and jars

- DO NOT break
- NO drinking glasses
- NO window glass
- NO ceramics
- NO lightbulbs

## Cardboard Bin These items only



- NO waxed cardboard
- NO paper boxes
- Corrugated cardboard  
*Flatten and keep dry*

## Mixed Paper Bin These items only

- Catalogs
- Magazines
- Mail
- Office paper
- Paper boxes (unwaxed)  
*cereal, crackers, snacks  
(remove the liner)*
- Paper bags
- Phone books
- School paper

Office and school paper



Paper bags



Phone books



Paper boxes (no liners)



Mail, magazines, catalogs and mixed paper

- NO shredded paper
- NO plastic bags
- NO newspaper
- NO cardboard
- NO egg cartons
- NO paper towel cores
- NO toilet paper cores

## Mixed Container Bin

These items only (Labels okay • Rinse • Discard lids)

- Aluminum beverage cans  
*(please empty and rinse)*
- Steel or tin cans  
*(rinse, leave lids attached, pushed down inside can)*
- Plastic-coated paper containers  
*milk cartons, juice boxes, frozen food containers*
- Plastic bottles, jugs, and dairy tubs  
*water, soft drink, shampoo, milk, juice, laundry detergent, cottage cheese yogurt, margarine*



Metal cans  
(Do not flatten)



Plastic coated paper or frozen food boxes  
(no food residue)



Milk-style cartons  
(Do not flatten)



Plastic bottles, jugs and dairy tubs  
(Do not flatten)

- NO hazardous/toxic product containers
- NO foil-lined drink cartons or juice boxes
- NO plastic buckets or plant pots
- NO plastic bags
- NO plastic or styrofoam take-out containers
- NO lids

### Why can't all plastics be recycled in Kitsap County?

Many plastic items cannot currently be recycled, even though they have recycling arrows on them. It is not economically feasible at this time.

### Sharps

Place in a sealed red sharps container from pharmacy or health care provider, or a hard plastic container with a screw-cap lid (soda, bleach, detergent bottle) and label with a biohazard sticker. Milk jugs and glass bottles are not accepted. Ask your pharmacist or health care provider if they accept used sharps.

### Antifreeze and Used Motor Oil

Residential customers only! Collect fluids in clean, dry containers. Do not mix fluids. Quantities limited to 10 gallons per customer. For amounts greater than 10 gallons or contaminated materials, use the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility. Oil filters accepted.

### Appliances

Customer must unload. Lifting may be required. A fee is charged.

### Compact Fluorescent Bulbs

Residential customers only! Limit of 10 tubes and/or bulbs per customer per

month. Tubes accepted at Poulsbo facility only and must be 4' or less in length. Broken bulbs not accepted.

### Monitors, CPU's, Laptops and TV's

Customer must unload. Lifting may be required.

### Scrap Metal

No items containing oil, gas, paint, and other fluids accepted. No rusty items. No cable accepted. No car parts. *All non-metal parts must be removed.*

### Yard Waste

Branches, lawn clippings, weeds, leaves, garden waste, brush, tree trimmings, and shredded paper. Customer unloads. Lifting may be required. No food waste, garbage, rocks, sod, dirt, or large stumps. Fee varies by location.

### Cover and secure your load!

Unsecured and uncovered loads cause highway accidents and up to 25% of roadside litter. Driving with an uncovered

and unsecured load can result in a traffic fine ranging from \$216 to \$5,000 and jail time. (RCW 46.61.655)

In addition, a \$10 fee is charged on any uncovered or unsecured load at all Kitsap County solid waste disposal facilities (KC282-2002).

Remember:

- Lighter goes lower. Put lighter weight things at the bottom of the load.
- Use a sturdy tarp or net to cover load.
- Tie it down with wire, rope, bungee cords, or straps. Tie large items directly to your vehicle. Tie down garbage can lids.
- Always double check your load.
- Don't overload.
