

Small Quantity Generator Program at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility

What Is The Small Quantity Generator (SQG) Program?

Kitsap County's Small Quantity Generator Program is an environmentally safe and affordable disposal/recycling option for small quantity generators of dangerous waste in Kitsap and Mason Counties. SQGs are businesses, government agencies, and non-profits that generate:

- Less than 220 pounds of dangerous waste (25 gallons of typical liquid waste) per month, with an accumulation limit of 2,200 pounds on-site at any time and
- Less than 2.2 pounds of acutely hazardous waste per month



What Is Dangerous Waste?

Dangerous waste has one or more of the following properties:

- **TOXIC** – poisonous to human health and/or the environment
- **FLAMMABLE** – easy to ignite
- **CORROSIVE** – eats away material or human tissue by chemical action
- **REACTIVE** – can chemically react to cause toxic gas, fire, or explosion

These are general definitions. See WAC 173-303-090 for details.

The Kitsap County SQG Program protects your business liability by providing proof of legitimate disposal. Kitsap County contracts with EPA registered hazardous waste transporters and receiving facilities to guarantee you environmentally sound waste management and stewardship. Whenever appropriate, SQG collected waste is reused or recycled. Delivery to the SQG program at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility saves you time, money and paperwork while integrating pollution prevention into your business.

Kitsap County's Small Quantity Generator Program is an environmentally safe and affordable disposal/recycling option for small quantity generators of dangerous waste in Kitsap and Mason Counties. SQGs are businesses, government agencies, and non-profits that generate:

- Less than 220 pounds of dangerous waste (25 gallons of typical liquid waste) per month, with an accumulation limit of 2,200 pounds on-site at any time and
- Less than 2.2 pounds of acutely hazardous waste per month



What Is Dangerous Waste?

Dangerous waste has one or more of the following properties:

- **CORROSIVE** – eats away material or human tissue by chemical action

Identify your waste with a Material Worksheet, receive a delivery date and time, and transport your waste.

STEP 1 – A completed Material Worksheet itemizing your waste materials is required prior to delivery to the Small Quantity Generator Program at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility. A Worksheet can be obtained:

STEP 2 – Kitsap County hazardous waste technicians will review your Material Worksheet to guarantee your wastes meet our acceptance policy and then call you to schedule a delivery date and time.

STEP 3 – Transport your hazardous waste to the collection facility on your scheduled date and time.

- Waste types should not be mixed together.
- Transport waste in closed, non-leaking containers; label for content.
- Haul waste carefully, preferably in your trunk or truck bed, to minimize container and content disruption.

The collection facility is located at 5551 SW Imperial Way, Port Orchard. We will only accept the waste types and quantities listed on your worksheet. Upon delivery, we will classify your waste by category and weigh it. We will provide you with a single, combined bill and receipt itemizing your waste and the amount due.
