Do I need to get rid of my old TV?

No. Analog TVs will still work with satellite hook ups or any level of cable service after the analog signal goes away. Customers using antennas will need to obtain a converter box before February 17, 2009. Converter boxes are available for sale at many retail stores selling televisions. Up to two coupons per household are available until March 31, 2009 while supplies last. Apply online at www.DTV2009.gov or call the hotline at 1-888-DTV-2009 (1-888-388-2009).

Do I need to get rid of my old TV?

No. Analog TVs will still work with satellite hook ups or any level of cable service after the analog signal goes away. Customers using antennas will need to obtain a converter box before February 17, 2009. Converter boxes are available for sale at many retail stores selling televisions.
