Do **NOT** bring **OIL-BASED PAINT, PESTICIDES OR HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS**—take to Hazardous Wastemobile • Auburn SuperMall • 1st and 3rd full weekends (Fri–Sun) of each month, year round • 10am–5pm • 206.296.4692 • [lhwmp.org](http://lhwmp.org)

Do **NOT** bring **LATEX PAINT** to recycling events or Wastemobile—please dry out and place in trash with the lid off. Helpful hint: Mix paint with kitty litter, shredded paper, saw dust or commercial paint hardener to dry out.

Scrap Wood	Clean, unpainted and untreated wood, plywood, pallets, dimensional lumber and crates.	<b>NO</b> dirty, painted, treated or laminated wood or particle board.	Nails do not need to be removed.	Search database for local “Wood” recyclers.
Bulky Brush and Branches	Stumps, logs and tree branches that are at least 3 inches in diameter and less than 4 feet long (those items that don’t normally fit in your yard debris cart).	<b>NO</b> yard debris such as grass clippings, sod, weeds, small twigs or garden waste. <b>NO</b> commercial loads.	<b>NO</b> assistance is available to unload stumps from vehicles. Search database for local “Yard Waste” recyclers.
Refrigerators, Freezers and Air Conditioners	Household refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners.	<b>NO</b> commercial appliances or automobile air conditioning units.	<b>\$10 cash fee</b> for each.	Search database for local “Appliance” recyclers.
Electronics	Keyboards, mice, printers, fax machines, scanners, cell phones and CD/DVD players.	<b>NO TVs, computers or monitors.</b> <b>NO</b> commercial equipment.		Search database for local “Electronics” recyclers.
Fluorescent Bulbs	Compact fluorescent bulbs, fluorescent tubes and mercury and sodium vapor lamps.	<b>NO</b> lighting fixtures or broken tubes. <b>NO</b> ballasts.	Limit of 10 bulbs per vehicle.	<b>Wastemobile.*</b>

Reusable Household Goods	Small working appliances, reusable clothing, shoes, pots, pans, bedding, books and toys.	<b>NO</b> broken, torn, stained, damaged or wet items. <b>NO</b> furniture, carpet or large appliances.	All items must be clean and in good enough condition for resale by a charitable organization.	Donate to local second hand store.
Petroleum-Based Products	Motor oil, gasoline, diesel fuel, 2-cycle mix, transmission fluid, brake fluid, kerosene, antifreeze and oil filters.	<b>NO</b> unmarked or mixed liquids. <b>NO</b> commercial loads.	Do not mix any liquids together. Please ensure containers are sealed and clearly labeled with contents.	<b>Wastemobile.*</b>
Rigid Plastic	Plastic nursery pots, flowerpots, buckets, CD cases, PVC pipe, children’s plastic toys and other rigid plastic.	<b>NO</b> dirty containers, hazardous chemical containers or containers with food residue. Styrofoam Blocks	Clean, white Styrofoam blocks.	<b>NO</b> urethane foam cushions, expanded polypropylene or foam insulation.	Expanded polystyrene only. Packing Peanuts	Clean packing peanuts.		Please keep packing peanuts in a box or bag.	Search database for local “Packing Material” recyclers.
Wires and Holiday Light Strands (first stop)	Holiday light strands (with or without bulbs), cords and wires.		Items will be recycled to raise money for charities.	Local collection locations listed at <a href="http://www.holidaylightsrecycling.com">www.holidaylightsrecycling.com</a> .
