Batteries (Household)	Free	Richmond Beach and Shoreline Libraries: Alkaline, nickel-cadmium, lithium-ion, small lead acid (less than 2 lb.) and other household batteries.

Hazardous Materials	Free for residents / businesses	Aurora Household Hazardous Waste Collection Site: 12550 Stone Ave N., Seattle, (206) 296-4692. Open Sun, Mon and Tues from 9:30 am – 4:30 pm. No appointments necessary. Items accepted include aerosols, antifreeze, automotive products, fluorescent bulbs & tubes, hobby chemicals, pesticides, oil, solvents, thinners and toxic cleaning products. Lhwmp.org

Metal	Free	Shoreline Recycling & Transfer Station: 2300 N. 165 th St, (206) 296-4466.
Motor Oil	Free	O'Reilly Auto Parts: 18021 Aurora Ave. N., (206) 533-0179, call ahead. O'Reilly Auto Parts: 20319 Ballinger Way N.E., (206) 361-1025, call ahead.
Paint (Latex)	Free	Air dry or solidify using pet litter or paint hardener, and place <u>open</u> container in your garbage. For oil-based paint see <i>Hazardous Materials</i> section above.
Plastic Bags (Grocery)	Free	Recycle clean, empty plastic grocery bags at your local grocery store.
Plastic Plant Pots	Free	Recycle in your curbside recycling cart or take clean, unbroken plant pots to Deseret Industries: 17935 Aurora Ave N., (206) 542-9447, or Shoreline Goodwill: 14500 15 th Ave N.E., (206) 631-8454.
Propane Tanks	Free	Not allowed in the garbage. See <i>Hazardous Materials</i> above. Empty gas canisters less than two pounds, such as small camp stove canisters, may be placed in the garbage.
Shredding	Free	Shredathon Events: atg.wa.gov/Shredathon.aspx
Styrofoam blocks and peanuts	Free	Many mail / packaging houses will accept foam peanuts for reuse. Free drop off center for Styrofoam blocks at 800 S.W. 43 rd St. Renton, west of IKEA.
Televisions	Free	Deseret Industries: 17935 Aurora Ave N., (206) 542-9447, or Shoreline Goodwill: 14500 15 th Ave N.E., (206) 631-8454.
