Re: Determination of Water Budget Neutrality for Request No. G4-36025

Dear Shannon Jelenek:

Thank you for submitting a Request for Determination of Water Budget Neutrality, which was received by the Department of Ecology (Ecology) office on October 22, 2018.

In accordance with Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 173-539A, Ecology has determined your proposed appropriation of groundwater, as mitigated by the trust water right identified in your request, will be water budget neutral with respect to Total Water Supply Available (TWSA) at Parker.

The information in the table below was based on the documents you provided.

Proposed Uses and Mitigation Offered:

Use	Proposed Total Annual Quantity (ac-ft/yr*)	Proposed Mitigation (ac-ft/yr*)
Indoor	0.784	0.235
Outdoor	0.043	0.039
Total	0.827	0.274

*ac-ft/yr = acre-feet per year (1 acre-foot = 325,851 gallons)

Consumptive use, totaling 0.274 ac-ft/yr, is proposed to be offset with Trust Water Right No. CS4-02255(A)CTCL@2. The total consumptive use does not exceed the amount of water available under the subject trust water right during the irrigation season. Please refer to the enclosed Advisory Letter for additional information.

Ecology has determined, based on review of your Request for Determination of Water Budget Neutrality and the accompanying materials, your proposed use of groundwater will be Water Budget Neutral as follows:

1. Water use is to be made within Parcel Nos. 630334 and 11875 located within the S½S½ of Section 19, T. 20 N., R. 14 E.W.M. In-home water use is for 2 connection, using 350 gallons per day, resulting in a consumptive use of 0.235 ac-ft/yr.
2. Outdoor irrigation water use for 0.023 acres results in a consumptive use of 0.039 ac-ft/yr.
3. Water will be obtained from up to two wells, located in Parcel Nos. 630334 and 11875 located within the S½S½ of Section 19, T. 20 N., R. 14 E.W.M.



4. Water use shall be recorded and reported as required under WAC 173-539A-070, and as described in the Advisory Letter enclosure.
5. You will record with the Kittitas County Auditor a property covenant as required under WAC 173-539A-050 that restricts or prohibits trees or shrubs over septic drain fields on Parcel Nos. 630334 and 11875.
6. You will record with the Kittitas County Auditor an appropriate conveyance instrument under which the applicant obtains an interest in Trust Water Right No. CS4-02255(A)CTCL@2 to offset consumptive use as described in this letter.
7. You will pay to Ecology the sum of \$95.04, which represents a proportionate amount of the payment due and owing to the United States for storage and delivery of water under Paragraph 15(a) of Water Storage and Exchange Contract No. 09XX101700, between the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and the State of Washington Department of Ecology, Yakima Project, Washington, dated January 29, 2009¹. The consumptive use of 0.144 acre-feet from September 1 through March 31, is subject to the terms and conditions in the Water Storage and Exchange Contract No. 09XX101700.
8. Any valid priority calls against Trust Water Right No. CS4-02255(A)CTCL@2 based on local limitations in water availability, will result in temporary curtailment of the use of water until the priority call for water ends.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision. The appeal process is governed by chapter 43.21B RCW and chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this decision on Ecology in paper form - by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in chapter 43.21B RCW and chapter 371-08 WAC.
