6. Remarks and Other Relevant Information:

Staff water 4 acres of landscaping and lawn around the Headquarters complex. In mid-summer the water level becomes low such that the siphon can no longer pull water from Oak creek without installing a check dam to pool water. This can cause a dry reach and impede fish passage downstream of the POD. When that happens, we request approval to pull water from the Tieton River directly to offset potential damage to habitat and fish life. The amount of diversion would remain the same, 0.125 cfs. Note that there are two separate rights under claim #2109. One right has an April 1, 1898 priority date and a quantity of 0.043 cfs while the other (this application) has a quantity of 0.082 cfs and a priority date of April 1, 1900. Only one diversion would be used at any one time. The place of use and the Qi and Qa of the water rights would remain the same. We are simply requesting an additional diversion point. It is requested that this application go through expedited processing under the Hillis Rule. (see attached Appendix A)



Appendix A

For consideration of the Hillis Rule expedited processing

Proposed additional point of diversion:

These water rights were adjudicated by the court (Court Claim 2109) in the Yakima Adjudication. Their priority dates are 1898 and 1900. These water rights are used annually by the WDFW to irrigate landscaping, turf, and a small wetland area at the Oak Creek Wildlife Area. Since these two rights were adjudicated in the amounts of 0.082 cfs and 0.043 cfs, one can assume that use has been demonstrated to that time from the first use of the water (April 1, 1898 and April 1, 1900). Wildlife Area personnel divert from Oak Creek using a siphon with a 4 inch pipe. The water is gravity-fed from Oak Creek into a holding pond that has developed into a wetland providing wildlife habitat. Water is then withdrawn via pump from a shallow ring well into the irrigation system to irrigate the four acres of lawn and landscaping at the Oak Creek Wildlife Area Headquarters. The wildlife area has used this water right beneficially every year. It is difficult to maintain prime in the siphon intake in Oak Creek in mid to late summer without installing a check dam to pool the water and maintain sufficient head to operate the diversion. We wish to avoid the adverse impacts to instream habitat and fish passage associated with installing a check dam in Oak Creek in order to maintain the diversion. Therefore, WDFW wishes to divert water from an additional point of diversion a short distance downstream in the Tieton River after that time that a check structure would be necessary in Oak Creek. This change in point of diversion would benefit Oak Creek by not drawing it down further in late summer, and avoiding habitat and fish passage impacts associated with instream work to construct a check dam and sump within the channel. The impact of a small water withdrawal (.125 cfs/56 gpm) will be minimal and the move is downstream.

In June of 1996, the agency requested a change in point of diversion from its prior location on the Tieton one mile upstream, to the current Oak Creek point of diversion. This move was approved by Ecology June 11, 2004. Our current request would add a second point of diversion in the Tieton River for approximately 45% of the irrigation season. The new point of diversion would be near the end of the Wildlife Area Headquarters road and a screened pipe would run through the culvert under the road to a pump that would pump the water from the river level up to the Headquarters complex. Only one of the two points of diversion would be in use at any one time. The attached map shows all three of these points: the diversion prior to 2004; the current diversion on Oak Creek; and the proposed additional diversion on the Tieton River.
