6. Remarks and Other Relevant Information:

The new Seaton Water Users Association (SWUA) pump site POD is on the west (right) bank of the Teanaway River, immediately upstream (northerly) of the Lambert Road Bridge, approximately 50 feet north and 50 feet west of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 33, being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, T. 20 N., R. 16 E.W.M.

The new Teanaway River Ranch Associates (TRRA, now Teanaway River Ranch Owners Association, TRROA) pump site POD is on the east (left) bank of the Teanaway River, immediately downstream (southerly) of the Red Bridge Road Bridge, approximately 900 feet south and 2,100 feet west of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 25, being within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 25, T. 20 N., R. 16 E.W.M.

The Adjudication Court confirmed individual water rights to the several members of SWUA and to the several members of TRROA with the entry of the CFO for Subbasin No. 3 (Teanaway River) on 2-08-2001.

BPA and Reclamation entered a contract in 1999 with SWUA members, and also entered a contract in 1999 with TRROA members, initially assigning 30% of their several 1882-1891 priority (SWUA members) and 1885 & 1894 priority (TRROA members) water rights to instream flow enhancement trust water right use, in perpetuity, in the Teanaway River (primary reach only) upon completion of new irrigation systems for SWUA and TRROA funded by BPA, and then later to assign 'up to an additional 20%' of their water rights to permanent instream flow trust water use after a 5-year trial period, if not needed for their off-stream water use. Though the Court confirmed the right to divert surplus water, when available, to five (5) SWUA members' water rights (I. Osmonovich 1882, Montgomery 1885, I. Osmonovich 1885, Pratt/Bergstrom 1885, and Stephenson 1885), and to all of the TRROA members' water rights, those water right holders agreed to forego their use of surplus water from the new SWUA and TRROA irrigation systems, and the new irrigation systems were subsequently designed and built, and have been operated, to not deliver any surplus water to the SWUA or TRROA members. SWUA and TRROA members have not used any surplus water since 2000 and those SWUA member and TRROA member surplus water rights have been abandoned and relinquished. These new SWUA and TRROA irrigation systems were completed during the year-2000 irrigation season.

The transfer of the 30% portion and the 'up to an additional 20%' portion of the SWUA and TRROA members' water rights to instream flow use was temporarily accomplished by the Court's 3-09-2000 and 6-14-2007 Orders Pendente Lite.

The 5-year trial period showed that the SWUA members and the TRROA members used, and shall retain, 70% of their instantaneous diversion rate in cfs, and 50% of their base annual water quantity (not including any surplus water) in af/yr. Thus 30% of the instantaneous diversion rate and 50% of the base annual water quantity (not including any surplus water) of the SWUA and TRROA members' water rights are to be transferred permanently to instream flow trust water use in the Teanaway River.

The Washington State Department of Ecology and each of the SWUA and TRROA members are submitting Joint Motions to Divide and Substitute Party to the Yakima Adjudication Court, transferring those 30% instantaneous diversion rate (cfs) and 50% base annual water quantity (af/yr) (not including any surplus water) portions of the Court-confirmed SWUA and TRROA members' water rights to Ecology for instream flow trust water use. Those Ecology portions of each of the SWUA and TRROA members' water rights are now the subject of the group of SWUA and TRROA members' permanent trust water right change applications submitted by Ecology concurrently with this application.

THIS APPLICATION: The Ecology instream flow trust water portion of the Court-confirmed Miller 1891 water right totals 0.048 cfs, 21.600 acre-feet of water per year, to be used for permanent instream flow enhancement in the Teanaway River from the location of the upstream Seaton Ditch POD to the location of the downstream new SWUA pump site POD above the Lambert Road Bridge.

Miller (SWUA member) retains her 70% instantaneous (cfs) and 50% base annual (af/yr) portions of her Court-confirmed Miller 1891 water right for continued use for irrigation of 8 acres and stock water during the irrigation season by way of the new, more-efficient SWUA irrigation delivery system. SWUA members have stopped (in year 2000) diverting water at the now-defunct Seaton Ditch POD, and have temporarily changed their Teanaway River POD to the new downstream SWUA pump site POD above the Lambert Road Bridge under authority of the 3-09-2000 Court Order Pendente Lite. The Miller retained portion of her Court-confirmed 1891 water right will be permanently diverted from the new SWUA pump site POD, in total not to exceed 0.112 cfs, 21.600 acre-feet of water per year for irrigation and 0.5 af/yr for stock water.

The court did not confirm any right to use surplus water under this Miller 1891 water right.

The place of use in the Teanaway River (primary reach only) for the Ecology permanent instream flow trust water rights derived from the SWUA members' 1882-1891 priority water rights is:
 from the original authorized point of diversion, the Seaton Ditch, situated in the NE¹/₄SE¹/₄ of Section 26, T. 20 N., R. 16 E.W.M., downstream to the new SWUA pump site location in the SE¹/₄SE¹/₄ of Section 33, T. 20 N., R. 16 E.W.M.

The place of use in the Teanaway River (primary reach only) for the Ecology permanent instream flow trust water rights derived from the TRROA members' 1885 & 1894 priority water rights is:
 from the original authorized point of diversion, the Haida-Peterson Ditch, situated in the SW¹/₄SW¹/₄ of Section 13, T. 20 N., R. 16 E.W.M., downstream to the new TRROA pump site location in the NW¹/₄NE¹/₄ of Section 25, T. 20 N., R. 16 E.W.M.

The 1999 BPA and Reclamation contract agreements with SWUA and TRROA assign Reclamation the responsibility of obtaining all necessary water right permit approvals to permanently transfer the instream flow portion of these water rights to the Yakima Basin Trust Water Rights Program, after the completion of the 5-year trial operation period, and also to change each of the water rights' authorized diversion points to the new pump site diversion points. That is why Ecology is filing these permanent trust water right applications at this time. These trust water right applications are being filed concurrently with water right change applications for the portions of each of the SWUA and TRROA members' water rights they retain for their continuing off-stream irrigation and stock water uses, requesting the change of point of diversion (POD): 1) from the former Seaton Ditch POD to the new downstream SWUA pump site (for the SWUA members' water rights), or 2) from the former Haida-Peterson Ditch POD to the new downstream TRROA pump site (for the TRROA members' water rights).

Diversion quantities under these water rights, both the off-stream diverted portions and the instream flow enhancement portions, have been recorded by the combination of the flow meters on the SWUA and TRROA irrigation pipelines and the USBR gaging station on the Teanaway River above Lambert Road. Stream Patrolman Stan Isley (appointed by the Court's 8/27/1998 Order Pendente Lite Re: Metering, Measuring and Reporting Requirements, Teanaway River and Big Creek, Kittitas County) monitors these two water right portions each year. These two portions of the SWUA and TRROA members' water rights have been fully exercised since construction of the new SWUA and TRROA irrigation systems was completed and operation began, certainly in the 2001 and subsequent irrigation seasons up to the present date.
