The Yakima River Basin Water Enhancement Project (YRBWEP), with cost-shares from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation), the Washington Dept. of Ecology (Ecology) and the Sunnyside Division (Sunnyside) including one of the Sunnyside Division's water right member entities the Benton Irrigation District (BID), has funded water conservation projects on the Sunnyside Division of the Federal Yakima Reclamation Project. YRBWEP is funding the Sunnyside Phase I (reregulation reservoirs and canal check structures and automation) and Sunnyside Phase II (lateral piping) water conservation projects, and also the BID water conservation project (new pumped diversion and pressurized pipeline delivery system). This trust water right application is number four (4) of six (6) concurrently-filed trust water right applications that will proportionally allocate conserved water derived from these water conservation projects among the 6 water rights confirmed to the United States/Sunnyside for irrigation and related uses from April 1 through October 31 each year by the Yakima Adjudication Court's 8-14-2003 Conditional Final Order (CFO). The applicant wishes to place this YRBWEP conserved water into the State Trust Water Rights Program consistent with the provisions of the 7-09-2008 "Memorandum of Understanding No. 1425-08MU1U7121 Between the United States Department of the Interior Bureau of Reclamation and the State of Washington Department of Ecology for Water Marketing and for Management of Trust Water Rights in the Yakima River Basin." This YRBWEP conserved water will be used for instream flow enhancement in the lower Yakima River, augmenting the target flows passing Sunnyside Diversion Dam (Parker) and the Prosser Diversion Dam (Prosser) managed by Reclamation, or will otherwise be used to augment instream flows for fish throughout the entire year. RCW 90.03.470(3)(c)(ii) provides that no (\$0.00) examination fee is required for "an application to process a change when the department otherwise acquires a trust water right for purposes of improving instream flows or for other public purposes".

<u>Default Target Flow Augmentation Use:</u> <u>The lower Yakima River: from the Sunnyside Diversion Dam at river mile (RM) 103.8, downstream to the new BID pumpsite diversion point at RM 32.5, and continuing downstream to the last point where return flows leaving the Sunnyside Division service area re-enter the Yakima River at the site of the old Kiona Canal Wasteway return at RM 23.8.</u>
<u>Shaped Releases of Stored Water:</u> <u>That portion of the entire Yakima River system lying downstream of the five (5) federal storage reservoirs (Rimrock lake, Bumping Lake, Lake Keechelus, Lake Kachess, and Lake Cle Elum).</u>

7. Remarks and Other Relevant Information:

The YRBWEP Sunnyside Phase I and Phase II water conservation projects create water savings by implementing water delivery system improvements on the Sunnyside Canal and lateral system. The BID water conservation project creates water savings by implementing a new pumped and pressurized pipeline water delivery system to be used solely on the BID portion of the

unitary Sunnyside Division place of use. No reduction in irrigated acreage is occurring as a result of these conservation projects. The additional (new) diversion for BID is the subject of 6 separate water right change applications filed with Ecology on 10-16-2008 and subsequently approved on 7-21-2010.

According to the provisions of the 1994 YRBWEP Act (Title XII of Public Law 103-434) and the YRBWEP funding agreements with the Sunnyside Division and BID, a total of 41,842 af/yr of conserved water is to be assigned to instream flow augmentation use in the Yakima River system. That represents the sum of 19,450 af/yr of Phase I Sunnyside ('2/3rds block') water savings, 16,971 af/yr of Phase II Sunnyside ('2/3rds block') water savings, 2,897 af/yr of BID ('2/3rds block') water savings, and 2,524 af/yr of additional BID ('conveyance water') water savings. These 41,842 af/yr of total Sunnyside Division conserved water are to be allocated proportionally among all six (6) of the Sunnyside Division irrigation season water rights, and retain the same status as their parent Sunnyside Division water rights, being 68.9% non-proratable and 31.1% proratable in the Yakima Basin's TWSA water management scheme.

This conserved water can be applied to primary-reach only instream flow trust water right use in the lower Yakima River below Sunnyside Diversion Dam, or can be retained in the five (5) federal water storage reservoirs for use in the Yakima River system below the reservoirs as shaped releases of stored water to augment flows for fish through March 31 of each following year, when such use causes no harm to the Yakima Basin's TWSA and its water users. These YRBWEP-funded Sunnyside Division water conservation projects will generate conserved water from each of the six Sunnyside Division water rights confirmed for irrigation and related uses during the April 1 through October 31 irrigation season. This conserved water is the water source for these 6 concurrently-filed trust water right applications and is the source of the water that will be assigned to use as instream flow augmentation trust water rights.

These 6 primary-reach-only trust water rights will primarily be assigned as constant-flow increases to the base YRBWEP target flows at Parker and Prosser as maintained by Reclamation. Such constant-flow use will be the default water use plan each year. However, Reclamation requests the right to shape the use of these instream flow augmentation trust water rights throughout the irrigation season, and through March 31st of each following year, in a way that will maximize the associated biological benefits. In other words, Reclamation may choose to deliver flow pulses or to otherwise shape the usage of these 6 instream flow trust water rights in a way other than as a constant and unvarying target flow increase throughout the entire irrigation season.

Reclamation will ensure that any such varying target flow augmentation usage does not exceed the annual acre-feet limits of the trust water rights and also that such usage does not cause detriment or injury to other existing water rights within the Yakima Basin under its TWSA management and operations.

Subsection 1205(a)(4)(B)(i) of the 1994 Federal YRBWEP Act states that instream target flow increases authorized by the Act "shall not further diminish the amount of water that otherwise would have been delivered by an entity to its water users in years of water proration." To comply with this requirement, Reclamation may need, during prorationing years, to proportionally reduce the instream target flow increase at the Prosser gaging station, as compared to the instream target flow increase at the Parker gaging station, derived from this Sunnyside Division water conservation project, to ensure that the Kennewick Irrigation District (KID) continues to have the same water availability in the future that it has historically enjoyed during prorationing years. KID has historically benefited, during prorationing years, from its ability to divert and use return flows from Sunnyside Division irrigated lands that return to the Yakima River above KID's Prosser Dam diversion point.

Reclamation will inform Ecology of its annual water usage plan in any given year

that Reclamation decides to not apply these trust water rights to constant-flow target flow augmentation use; and Reclamation will so inform Ecology prior to varying from the established default constant-flow augmentation use. These conservation projects will not be fully implemented until 2032.


