Hi Aaron,

I understand that getting the signatures seems like a cumbersome exercise for putting these water rights into trust, however, there is no flexibility in the water code or current policy for us to work with. After looking at the Okanogan County parcel data, there were a couple of things that came to mind.

1. Water Right donation 28101C2@ requires the most signatures. They include:

- Scroggie
- Sunshine Agriculture
- Greene
- Thomas
- Hernandez
- Douglas Co. PUD #1
- Pateros School District #122

2. For the S3-21752C donation only the Scroggies need to provide signatures.

3. For the G4-28100C donation, only the Scroggie and the Hernandez land owners fall within the place of use. I don't know whether they live on their parcels, but if they do, their signatures shouldn't be hard to get.

4. For the CV1-4P261 donation, the Scroggie, Hernandez and Sunshine Agriculture are needed.

If there was a way for the Moores to irrigate the two acres (S4-28101C), or offer to let someone else irrigate a couple of acres that might be a simpler solution (if used from the appropriate point of diversion). The water right the two acres fall under is a Family Farm Act (FFA) provisioned water right along with the G4-28100C right. There is a risk at putting such rights into trust. The trust statutes don't address FFA rights so it is unclear if or how well they are protected in trust. Getting the signatures is not a guarantee of

protection in the trust program given the FFA issue. Is it worth the effort for the 2 acres to the Moores?

It's important for Moores to act on these donations or irrigate. The only thing I need to process them is the signatures at this point. Let me know what they plan to do.
