

## Ken McBride



Ken McBRIDE Ken McBride, age 59, passed away peacefully April 13, 2010 in Seattle. He was surrounded by his family in the same room his daughter was married in just six weeks earlier. He was born on May 23, 1950 in Seattle and remained a life-long resident. A devoted father, his children are the fourth generation of McBrides living in Magnolia, a point in which he took great pride. Ken attended Magnolia Elementary, Catherine Blaine Jr. High, Queen Anne High and the University of Washington where he attained both his Bachelor and Master degrees. While attending UW he met his wife Patty whom he dated for seven years before finally joining her at the altar. From that point on they shared in the many hats that Ken wore: family man, collector, entrepreneur, cowboy, rancher, athlete, prankster, confidant, community leader, car guy, builder, unabashed Republican, coach, philanthropist, wine buff, carnivore and consummate life of the party. 'Cowboy?' As Ken always said, he had the big hat, horse and cattle to prove it. Perhaps most significant in this list was that Ken was a builder. Ken built a family on the foundation of an amazing partnership of over 40 years with his wife Patty. Dear Applicant:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you about options regarding your pending ground water right application No. G4-32037 T, filed with the Department of Ecology (Ecology) on 6/15/1994, located in the Yakima Basin, specifically Kittitas County. We appreciate your patience with the water right permitting process. As a result of water shortages and legal challenges, water supplies in the Yakima Basin have been at risk and under litigation for years, and Ecology has not been able to issue new water right permits during that time. A comprehensive study has been recently completed that now allows us to move forward in the processing of water rights applications in your area.

The Yakima River Basin Surface Water Adjudication<sup>1</sup> (Adjudication) is entering its 35<sup>th</sup> year and moving toward completion. The Adjudication and other applicable state and federal Court decisions have clearly determined that water supply in the Yakima River Basin is over appropriated. In other words, the courts have said that more surface water rights have been confirmed in the Adjudication than there is water legally available to appropriate. This condition is more severe during low water years, when the basic tenet of Western Water Law is relevant – first in time, first in right. Those with surface water rights in the Yakima Basin with priority dates after May 10, 1905, have frequently been limited or curtailed during low water years.<sup>2</sup> The purpose of curtailment is to protect access to water for senior water right holders.

In September 2011, the United States Geological Survey (USGS) released the final report on the Yakima Basin Groundwater Study.<sup>3</sup> This 12-year study confirmed that groundwater and surface water are directly connected in the Yakima Basin.

The study also demonstrates that pumping groundwater wells in Kittitas County reduces streamflow and would add to the existing water deficit in the Yakima Basin.

Therefore, Ecology anticipates that it will be unable to approve any pending applications for new surface water or groundwater rights in this county unless an applicant is able to mitigate for the expected impact of the new water use. This is because a formal permit decision would likely conclude that under state law: 1) water is not available for new appropriation, 2) a new appropriation would impair existing water rights, and 3) a new appropriation would not be in the public interest. (RCW 90.03.290)

The good news is the Yakima Basin Integrated Water Resources Management Plan<sup>4</sup> (Integrated Plan) is working to fill the Basin's existing deficit and may even provide some additional water supplies in the basin for future uses. Unfortunately, the Integrated Plan is a long-term solution and is not the short-term answer.

Based on our review of your application, we have determined that your water right application is junior to the critical date of May 10, 1905, and will likely have an impact on surface water in the Yakima Basin unless mitigated. Therefore, we ask that you consider, and subsequently choose one of the following options regarding your pending water right application on the enclosed Statement of Intent form.

#### Application Processing Options

- A. **Mitigate**<sup>5</sup> - In the case of your application, providing a mitigation plan that protects existing water rights by offsetting the flow impacts to the Yakima River and/or nearby tributary creeks may allow Ecology to approve your application that otherwise would likely be denied because it does not meet the legal requirements of water availability, impairment, or public interest. A mitigation plan should describe the effects of your proposed water use and present a proposal to alleviate those effects.
- a. **Mitigate with Plan.** By selecting this option, you choose to include a mitigation plan to support processing your application. The mitigation plan must offset the adverse impacts to the state's water resources that would be caused by the new consumptive use identified in your application, and must protect existing water rights by offsetting adverse flow impacts to either the Yakima River and/or a more nearby tributary creek.
  - b. **On-hold.** By selecting this option, you choose to place your application On-Hold, while you pursue mitigation. A mitigation plan can be submitted at any time in the future to accompany your application. You will not lose the priority date of your application as a result of selecting this option.

- B. **Process** - You may request that your application continue to be processed to a formal decision without providing or seeking mitigation.
- a. **Process – Non-Consumptive.** By selecting this option, you request that your application be processed at this time because your project qualifies as a non-consumptive<sup>6</sup> use. A non-consumptive water use does not diminish the water source or impair existing water rights.
  - b. **Process – Consumptive, Without Mitigation.** By selecting this option, you request that your application be processed in its current state, though an approval is unlikely. Groundwater and surface water are not available for further consumptive appropriation in the subbasin where your application is pending. Exercising this option requires Ecology to make a formal decision on your application that is appealable pursuant to RCW 43.21B.310.
- C. **Assign** – If you are no longer the current owner of the place where the permit application was intended to be used, selecting this option requests that your interest in the permit application be assigned to another person. This requires an assignment form and fee be filed with Ecology for the application (RCW 90.03.310). Assignment forms are available at <http://www.ecy.wa.gov/biblio/ecy040161.html>.
- D. **Withdraw** - If you are no longer interested in pursuing your application to appropriate public waters of the state, selecting this option will withdraw your application and remove it from the list of pending applications. Withdrawal is voluntary.

This letter and the enclosed Statement of Intent Form have been sent to determine the next steps regarding No. G4-32037 T. This letter is not an Administrative Order issued by Ecology pursuant to RCW 43.27A.190, nor is issuance of this letter an appealable action pursuant to RCW 43.21B.310.

Please reply within ninety (90) days of the date of this letter by choosing one option on the enclosed Statement of Intent Form and mailing it back to Ecology using the enclosed postage-paid envelope.

**If you do not respond within ninety (90) days of the date of this letter or do not return the enclosed form, Ecology will process the application in its current state. An approval is unlikely; a formal decision is likely to result in a denial of the application based on groundwater and surface water not being available for further consumptive appropriation in the subbasin where your application is pending. A formal decision will result in an appealable action pursuant to RCW 43.21B.310.**


