Re: Emergency Drought Authorization under Application No. G4-32022

In accordance with the provisions of RCW 43.83B.405, on May 12, 1994, it was ordered and determined by the Director of the Department of Ecology that the Yakima River basin is under drought conditions. In accordance with the provisions of WAC 173-166-060, the Washington State Department of Ecology is under the terms of this Order, issuing an EMERGENCY DROUGHT PERMIT. This authorization is conditioned by the following provisions and limitations:

1. The initiation date of this EMERGENCY PERMIT is June 9, 1994.

This EMERGENCY PERMIT will terminate on or before December 1, 1994, unless sooner revoked by the Director of the Department of Ecology. **THIS AUTHORIZATION SHALL IN NO MANNER BE CONSTRUED TO GUARANTEE OR IMPLY THAT A FINAL (REGULAR) PERMIT WILL ISSUE FOR THE FUTURE USE OF THE FACILITY HEREIN AUTHORIZED.**

2. This authorization allows the use of an existing well located approximately 100 feet south and 1380 feet east of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of Section 5; being within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 5, T. 10 N., R. 22 E.W.M. The construction of this well was authorized under Ground Water Permit No. G4-30241P.
3. The following well construction requirements must be satisfied before water use as described below can be started:

For the purpose of making water level measurements, installation and maintenance of an access port as described in Ground Water Bulletin No. 1 is required. An air line and gage are also required when the well has a static water level greater than 100 feet below land surface. The air

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line shall be constructed of 1/4 inch minimum diameter galvanized steel pipe, or comparable material if pre-approved by the department. The air line shall be equipped with a standard tire (Schrader) valve. Distance from land surface to the bottom end of the air line shall be clearly posted at the well site, accurate to 0.5 feet or less. The air line, access port, and all well equipment shall be installed and maintained to provide access for measurement of water levels.

All water wells constructed within the state shall meet the minimum standards for construction and maintenance as provided under RCW 18.104 (Washington Water Well Construction Act of 1971) and Chapter 173-160 WAC (Minimum Standards for Construction and Maintenance of Water Wells).

4. A suitable flow meter approved by the Department of Ecology shall be installed and maintained in accordance with WAC 508-64-020 through WAC 508-64-040. (Installation, operation and maintenance requirements attached hereto.)

Whenever water is being diverted, bi-weekly (every two weeks) readings of the flow meter shall be recorded and maintained by the permittee. These readings shall be documented by time, date, withdrawal rate, and the person conducting the measurements. Copies of these records shall be submitted to the Department of Ecology at the end of the 1994 irrigation season.

5. The quantity of water to be withdrawn under this permit is limited to 790 gallons per minute (gpm) and 84 acre-feet per year. This is based upon the instantaneous quantity of 7½ gpm per acre and an annual quantity of 0.8 acre-feet per acre.
6. Water is to be used for supplemental irrigation of 105 acres from May 15 to December 1, 1994. The place of use is described as follows:

Parcels "A" and "B" described as follows:

PARCEL "A": The SW¼SW¼, AND the W½SW¼SE¼SW¼ of Section 32, T. 11 N., R. 22 E.W.M.; EXCEPT the South 38 feet thereof for County Road; EXCEPT the West 30 feet of the South 125 feet thereof for County Road; AND EXCEPT right-of-way for road along the West side thereof.

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PARCEL "B": Government Lots 3 and 4 (the N $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 5, T. 10 N., R. 22 E.W.M.; EXCEPT the North 25 feet; the West 25 feet and the East 30 feet; EXCEPT the East 5 feet of the West 30 feet of the North 112 feet of said NW $\frac{1}{4}$ for roads; EXCEPT right-of-way for laterals conveyed to the United States of America, under Auditor's File No. 983040, records of Yakima County, Washington; TOGETHER WITH that portion of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 5, T. 10 N., R. 22 E.W.M., described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the South line of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 5, 462.5 feet East of the Southwest corner of said SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$; thence North 20°10' East along a certain ravine a distance of 524 feet; thence North 17°08' East along the ravine a distance of 633.5 feet; thence North 7°53' East along said ravine a distance of 210 feet, more or less, to the North line of said SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$; thence West along said North line of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ to the Northwest corner thereof; thence South along the West line of said Section 5 a distance of 1429.9 feet, more or less, to the point of intersection of said West line and the North right-of-way line of the Outlook Irrigation District Supply Lateral; thence Easterly and Southerly along said North right-of-way line to its intersection with the ravine aforesaid; thence North 13°04' East along said ravine a distance of 316 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning; EXCEPT the West 25 feet for road.

7. The irrigation water herein authorized to be withdrawn is supplemental to water made available under primary rights by the Roza Irrigation District. The only water herein permitted for withdrawal is water necessary to alleviate hardships and reduce burdens on water users arising from drought conditions. This amount shall not exceed 0.8 acre-feet per year per acre.
8. Withdrawal of water under this right may be limited or otherwise regulated in favor of senior rights.


You have the right to obtain review of this order. Request for review must be made, within thirty (30) days of receipt of this order, to the Washington Pollution Control Hearings Board, PO Box 40903, Olympia, Washington 98504-0903. Concurrently, a copy of the request must be sent to the Department of Ecology, PO Box 47600, Olympia, Washington 98504-7600. These procedures are

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consistent with the provisions of Chapter 43.21B RCW and the rules and regulations adopted thereunder.
