





Re: Emergency Drought Permit No. G4-35017

Dear Mr. Barwin:

As stated in Emergency Drought Permit No G4-35017, the following letter states my intended procedure to modify the existing well located in the SW1/4 NW1/4 Sec. 36 T.11N., R.22E. Yakima Co.

This well is 3700 feet in depth with casing and pressure grout installed to 1900 feet. The driller stated in the water well report that 1001 cubic feet of neat cement had been used.

My intent is to backfill the well bore hole with clean gravel up to the 1800 foot level and place 20 feet of Bentonite on the gravel. After the installation of the Bentonite plug, the well will be tagged to establish its depth.

The next step is to attempt perforating the casing and grout. That will be from 1445 feet to the 1550 foot level. The process that will be used is wireline perforating. After perforating, the well will be cleaned and developed until clean and a satisfactory production rate is accomplished.

If this process fails to meet the requested needs, it would be my desire to request the Department of Ecology approval to move the well location by approximately 100 feet and drill a new well 16 inches in diameter, 1600 feet in depth. I hope this will not be needed.

To conclude, I would like to thank the Department for their expeditious handling of my request.
