PROVISIONS

All conditions and requirements contained in reports of examination or permits previously issued apply to this certificate unless specifically noted below.

Quantity Limits, Flow and Regulation:

This certificate authorizes three points of withdrawal in the amounts of 155 gallons per minute; 250 acre-feet per year (5 acre-feet per year for multiple domestic supply and 245 acre-feet per year for power house cooling), continuously, each year.

Ground Water Certificate No. G3-30098 is issued as a back-up water supply to the surface water diversion from Gardner Creek under Surface Water Permit No. S3-30103P. The powerhouse cooling portion under this certificate is used as an alternate supply to Surface Water Permit No. S3-30103P.

Municipal Supply and Public Water Systems:


Prior to any new construction or alterations of a public water supply system, the State Board of Health rules require public water supply owners to obtain written approval from the Office of Drinking Water of the Washington State Department of Health. The right to use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, except as provided in RCW 90.03.380, 90.03.390, and 90.44.100.

This certificate of water right is specifically subject to relinquishment for non-use of water as provided in Chapter 90.14 RCW.

Wells, Well logs and Well Construction Standards:

All wells constructed in the State shall meet the construction requirements of chapter 173-160 WAC entitled "Minimum Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Wells" and chapter 18.104 RCW titled "Water Well Construction".

Installation and maintenance of an access port as described in chapter 173-160 WAC is required. An air line and gauge may be installed in addition to the access port.

All unused wells shall be decommissioned in accordance with Chapter 173-160-381 WAC.

General Conditions:

The water source and/or water transmission facilities are not wholly located upon land owned by the applicant. Issuance of a water right change authorization by this department does not convey a right of access to, or other right to use, land which the applicant does not legally possess. Obtaining such a right is a private matter between applicant and owner of that land.

Use of water under this authorization shall be contingent upon the water right holder's maintenance of efficient water delivery systems and use of up-to-date water conservation practices consistent with established regulation requirements and facility capabilities.

Schedule and Inspections:

Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access at reasonable times, to the project location, and to inspect at reasonable times wells or diversions and associated distribution systems for compliance with water law.

Measurements, Monitoring, Metering and Reporting:

An approved measuring device shall be installed and maintained for each of the sources identified herein in accordance with the rule "Requirements for Measuring and Reporting Water Use," Chapter 173-173 WAC. Water use data shall be recorded weekly and maintained by the property owner for a minimum of five years, and shall be promptly submitted to Ecology upon request.

The rule above describes the requirements for data accuracy, device installation and operation, and information reporting. It also allows a water user to petition Ecology for modifications to some of the requirements. Installation, operation and maintenance requirements are enclosed as a document entitled "Water Measurement Device Installation and Operation Requirements".

Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access at reasonable times, to the records of water use that are kept to meet the above conditions, and to inspect at reasonable times any measuring device used to meet the above conditions.

Chapter 173-173 WAC describes the requirements for data accuracy, device installation and operation, and information reporting. It also allows a water user to petition Ecology for modifications to some of the requirements. Installation, operation and maintenance requirements are enclosed as a document entitled "Water Measurement Device Installation and Operation Requirements".

The Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) has recommended that water rights from the Pend Oreille River be conditioned with instream flows of 7, 700 cubic feet per second (cfs) on a year-round basis (as measured at the gage near Newport, Washington).
