WRIA 41 - Grant County – Quincy Basin Subarea

Dear Mr. Shannon,

Part of my job as the state Watermaster for the Middle Columbia Basin is to monitor water usage in the area. In doing that, a question has come up about a parcel of land which you apparently own. This parcel (#141650000) is 2.88 acres just to the north of Ephrata on Road B. Since it appears that the parcel is being fully irrigated I'm wondering what authorization you have for the irrigation.

A brief review of our records didn't turn up any water rights for this parcel. Lacking a regular water right, some folks who use wells may be entitled to what is called the 'domestic exemption'. Under this exemption, you are allowed to use up to 5000 gallons per day from your well for in-house use and for the irrigation of up to ½ acre of lawn & garden.

I'm enclosing a little information about the domestic exemption and water rights. Please give me a call so we can discuss your water right situation. I can be reached as indicated below, and feel free to call any time.
