

Dear Mr. Briggs:

On May 20, 1991, Gary Briggs filed the following ground water applications:

- Ground Water Application No. G2-28151 was filed to secure rights to withdraw an additional 900 gallons per minute (gpm) from a well currently authorized under Certificate No. G2-21971C to withdraw 150 gpm. The well named under Certificate No. G2-21971C is used for irrigation and is located within the N $\frac{1}{2}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29, T. 17 N., R. 5 W W.M., Grays Harbor County, Washington. Certificate No. G2-21971C has a priority date of March 4, 1974.
- Ground Water Application No. G2-28152 was filed to secure rights to withdraw an additional 1600 gallons per minute (gpm) from two wells currently authorized under Certificate No. G2-21968C to withdraw 400 gpm. The wells named under Certificate No. G2-21968C are used for irrigation and are located within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 20, T. 17 N., R. 5 W W.M., Grays Harbor County, Washington. Certificate No. G2-21968C has a priority date of March 4, 1974.
- Ground Water Application No. G2-28153 was filed to secure rights to withdraw an additional 350 gpm from a well currently authorized under Certificate No. G2-21970C to withdraw 850 gpm. The well named under Certificate No. G2-21970C is used for irrigation and is located within the N $\frac{1}{2}$  of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29, T. 17 N., R. 5 W W.M., Grays Harbor County, Washington. Certificate No. G2-21970C has a priority date of March 4, 1974.

A request to test these wells was submitted on January 14, 1992. A preliminary permit is required prior to testing.

Under the provisions of Chapters 90.03.250 and 90.44.020 Revised Code of Washington, the Department of Ecology may issue a preliminary permit to enable an applicant to gather information needed to assess potential impacts of a proposed project. The wells are located approximately one-half mile from the Chehalis River. In issuing this preliminary permit, the Department of Ecology requests that you provide additional information to enable us to quantify the potential impacts of the increased pumping on other water right holders and on the Chehalis River.

The possibility exists that these wells are completed in a confined aquifer that is not directly continuous with the Chehalis River. It is the responsibility of the applicant to show if this is the case.

This letter serves as a preliminary permit to test the above referenced wells. The preliminary permit is issued subject to the following conditions:



1. The effective date of this preliminary permit is March 2, 1992.
2. Only the four production wells identified under Certificate No. G2-21968C, G2-21970C, and G2-21971C may be tested under this preliminary permit. At the completion of testing, withdrawals from these wells shall be limited to the certificated amounts noted above pending analysis of the test data and issuance of the Department's formal report of examination. No additional waters may be withdrawn for consumptive use, other than for testing purposes, unless and until a formal water right permit has been issued.
3. The maximum instantaneous withdrawals authorized under this preliminary permit are as follows:
  - a. 1050 gpm from the well identified under Certificate No. G2-21971C.
  - b. 2000 gpm from the two wells (combined) identified under Certificate No. G2-21968C.
  - c. 1200 gpm from the well identified under Certificate No. G2-21970C.
4. The services of a qualified hydrogeologist shall be retained to oversee testing of the wells.

Step Test: A step test shall be performed on each of the four wells to determine well pumping capacity relative to the proposed additional ground water withdrawals.

Aquifer Test: At a minimum, an aquifer test shall be conducted using the well identified under Certificate No. G2-21971C as the pumping well following the procedure described below:

- a. Pump the well identified under Certificate No. G2-21971C at a constant rate of 1050 gpm, and monitor the water level in the well during the pumping and recovery phases of the test.
- b. Use the other three wells, identified under Certificate No. G2-21968C and G2-21970C, as observation wells; monitor water levels in these wells throughout pumping and recovery of the test well.
- c. The test well shall be pumped for a minimum of 24 hours for confined aquifer conditions, or 72 hours for unconfined aquifer conditions, or until drawdown stabilizes, whichever is greater. Stabilization is defined as less than 0.05 feet of drawdown per hour of pumping. At the end of pumping, the wells shall be monitored until complete recovery has occurred.

The above testing requirements do not preclude the applicant from conducting additional well tests as needed, so long as the conditions of this preliminary permit are met.




5. The aquifer test must be designed and conducted using standard aquifer test procedures as outlined in Department of Ecology WRIS Information Bulletin No. 30, Aquifer Testing Procedures. The following information shall be determined and reported:
  - a. Antecedent water level and barometric pressure trends during the 48-hour period preceding the aquifer test.
  - b. Aquifer transmissivity
  - c. Aquifer storage coefficient or specific yield
  - d. The probable hydraulic response (drawdown) of the supplying aquifer to the proposed additional ground water withdrawals (from the four wells), with respect to distance and time.
  - e. The effect of the proposed ground water withdrawals (from the four wells) on existing ground water users. If existing senior right holders are adversely affected while conducting the aquifer test, the test shall be terminated.
  - f. The effect of the proposed ground water withdrawal on flows in the Chehalis River for which base flows have been established under Chapter 173-522, Washington Administrative Code.
6. When testing is complete, the data shall be analyzed, and all pertinent information, including copies of the field data sheets shall be submitted to the Department of Ecology in a completion report. The report shall contain the information requested in Item 5 above, as well as the following information:
  - a. A map showing the distance and bearing from the test well to all observation wells, springs, and streams monitored during the test.
  - b. The distance (to the nearest foot) from the production well to each observation well used during the test.
  - c. A description of all measuring points, including elevation to the nearest foot relative to mean sea level.
  - d. The total depth, screen length, and screen depth for each well monitored during the test.
  - e. A geologic log for each well monitored during the test which describes the lithology and thickness of the geologic units encountered during well construction.
  - f. An as-built drawing showing well construction details (casing diameter and type, seal type and locations, etc.), and the static water level of all water-bearing formations encountered during well construction.
7. All expenses, liabilities, and risks incurred during testing of the wells shall be borne by the applicant. In issuing this preliminary permit, the Department of Ecology in no way guarantees or implies that a non-interruptable permit will be granted to withdraw water from these wells. If testing indicates a potential significant

impact to the Chehalis River or existing right holders, the permit applications for additional ground water withdrawal may be denied, the quantity of water requested may be reduced, or withdrawals may be limited to certain times of the year.

8. This preliminary permit expires on March 2, 1993 unless sooner revoked by the Department of Ecology. This preliminary permit may be extended if a written request justifying an extension is made at least 30 days prior to expiration.




