Hello,

I'm writing to ask for your help on a project. A number of people from Sequim and Port Angeles who helped develop the Elwha-Dungeness Watershed Plan are working on accomplishing the goals of the plan. As part of this, we need to estimate future water demand for the Dungeness watershed. A piece of this estimate will be based on the applications for water rights currently on file with the Department of Ecology.

You are receiving this letter with the return envelope and form because you have an application pending with Ecology for water from the Dungeness area.

Because a number of things may have changed since you filed your application, we'd like to hear from you. Plans may be different, property may have been sold, or you might have acquired water through other means.

Is your application still accurate? Your answer will help us more realistically estimate the amount of water that's being requested.

Action required on the enclosed form:

Please indicate if you still need water for your project.

If yes, your application will remain on file with Ecology. **OR**

If you do not need the water, please check that box and I can pass the information to staff in Ecology's Water Resources Program. **AND**

If you no longer own the property, please provide contact information for the new owner.



PLEASE NOTE

Ecology is not taking action on pending applications for water rights at this time.

Action will be taken after a Dungeness instream flow and water management rule has been adopted and enough information is available to make decisions.

The Dungeness rule is currently being discussed, and formal review of a draft rule is planned for late this summer. A public workshop is being held at the John Wayne marina in Sequim, from 4 to 7 p.m. on March 26th. We'll be talking about elements of the rule and options for water management. There will also be an announcement in the Sequim Gazette.




Your application for the appropriation of water has been assigned the above referenced number. Please refer to this number in future correspondence.

Enclosed is a notice of your application which must be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a qualified legal newspaper of general circulation in the County or Counties in which the storage, diversion, and use is to be made and in other newspapers as directed. A list of these newspapers in your county is enclosed. The applicant is responsible for the payment of the publication. Please read the notice carefully to make sure it is correct. Should you find an error, please return the notice to our office for correction.

You should mail or deliver the enclosed notice to a newspaper regarding publication as soon as possible. When you receive the affidavit of publication with the news clipping from the newspaper, please forward the original to this office promptly. Further processing of the application will not be made until the affidavit is returned.

Since your application is for service of more than one residence, it is considered a public water supply. Public water supply systems are required to be approved by either the Local Health Department or the State Department of Health, depending upon system size. If you have not already done so, I suggest that you contact your Local Health Department or DOH, Drinking Water Section, Olympia, Washington, for further information.

Re: Ground Water Application No. G2-28784

Upon preliminary review of your application, it was determined that your well site is located within the groundwater basin of Matriotti Creek. The Department of Fisheries has requested that a low flow of 3 cfs be maintained in Matriotti Creek. Groundwater withdrawals which would affect streamflows will be subject to restrictions, such as in-house domestic use only.

In addition, the well is located within the Dungeness-Quilcene Planning Area. Your proposal will be evaluated in a manner consistent with the regional planning process. As with all groundwater withdrawals, senior water rights must be protected. Due to the density of wells in this area, we must also determine that the proposed withdrawals will not impair existing water rights.

A minimum of a pump test conducted at 130 gpm according to standard Department of Health procedures, will be required in order for us to evaluate your request. If such a pump test is available, please submit a copy of the pump test data at this time.

Under the provisions of Chapters 90.03.290 and 90.44.020, the Department of Ecology may issue a preliminary permit to drill and test a well so that an applicant may gather the information needed to assess the potential impacts of a proposed project. If you wish to obtain a preliminary permit to test this well, you may submit a written request along with your affidavit of publication, after you have published the enclosed public notice.
