It is your responsibility to check the notice carefully before having it published. If you find an error, please contact this office for resolution. If we later find an error in your public notice, you may be required to publish an amended notice at your expense.

Publishing Legal Notice

You need to arrange and pay for the legal notice to be published in a newspaper in **Pacific**.

- Publish in a newspaper from the enclosed list.
- The paper selected must have general circulation in the area the water will be used and diverted.
- It must appear once a week for two consecutive weeks.

If your published notice does not meet the above criteria, you will be required to have the notice republished at your expense.

**Publication should start within 30 days from the date of this letter.**



Next Step

You must request an *Affidavit of Publication* from the newspaper in which your notice appeared. The affidavit must be an original, notarized copy of your published notice. Please forward it to our office within 30 days of final publication.

The Department of Ecology has received your water right application. We have assigned it the number shown above. Please include this number if you contact us regarding your application.

Generally, applications are grouped by watershed and are processed according to the date of submittal. It will be some time before we begin working in your area, due to funding and staff limitations. When we start actively evaluating applications in your watershed, we will prepare a public notice and send it to you with publication instructions. The filing of your application does not give automatic permission to start your project.

The availability of water in Washington is a serious problem. Much of the water in our state has already been appropriated. With the many demands on the state's water resources, a favorable permit decision is not always possible. You may want to consider purchasing all or part of an existing water right.
