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PROVISIONS

"This permit incorporates and is issued subject to the January 15, 1992, Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Clark County, Clark Public Utilities, and the Department of Ecology. The MOU provides for assessment of water availability and impact to senior rights for this permit, in accordance with the Water Resources Plan to be completed under the MOU."

This permit is subject to the implementation of the minimum requirements established in the Interim Guidelines for Public Water Systems Regarding Water Use Reporting, Demand Forecasting Methodology and Conservation Programs.

An approved metering device shall be installed and maintained in accordance with RCW 90.03.360, WAC 508-64-020 through -040. Meter readings shall be recorded at least monthly.

Installation and maintenance of an access port as described in WAC 173-160-355 is required. An air line and gauge may be installed in addition to the access port. Water levels shall be measured and recorded using a consistent methodology, in accordance with accepted industry standards. Such measurements shall be made at least monthly. The length of the pumping period or recovery period prior to each measurement shall be constant, and shall be included in the record.

The Water Resources Act of 1971 specifies certain criteria regarding utilization and management of the waters of the state in the best public interest. Use of water may be subject to regulation at certain times, based on the necessity to maintain water quantities sufficient for preservation of the natural environment.

Under RCW 90.44.250 and 90.54.030, the Department of Ecology is directed to become informed as to all phases of the water resources of the state, and is authorized to make such investigations as may be necessary to determine the location, extent, depth, volume, and flow of all ground waters within the state. Accordingly, a summary of the previous year's monthly water level data and monthly totals of water pumped for this well, shall be submitted to Ecology's Southwest Regional Office annually during the month of February, or more frequently if requested by Ecology.

This permit shall be subject to cancellation should the permittee fail to comply with the above development schedule and/or fail to give notice to the Department of Ecology on forms provided by that Department documenting such compliance.
