#### LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF AUTHORIZED PLACE OF USE

Lot 1 of Large Lot Subdivision No. LLS-0176, recorded December 3, 2982, under File No. 8212030014, EXCEPT the East 5 feet for county road. TOGETHER WITH an easement for ingress, egress and utilities over the East 30 feet of the West 446 feet of the North 826 feet of the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 11, T. 17 N., R. 1 W.W.M., EXCEPT that portion lying Northerly of the Southerly line of Spurgeon Creek Road.

### Measurement of Water Use

### Provisions

Aquaculture use under this authorization shall be non-consumptive. All groundwater withdrawn for aquaculture shall be discharged to the on-site infiltration gallery.

Domestic water use under this authorization shall be limited to single domestic in-house use. Outside irrigation is not authorized.

#### Wells, Well Logs and Well Construction Standards

All wells constructed in the state shall meet the construction requirements of WAC 173-160 titled "Minimum Standards for the Construction and Maintenance of Wells" and RCW 18.104 titled "Water Well Construction". Any well which is unusable, abandoned, or whose use has been permanently discontinued, or which is in such disrepair that its continued use is impractical or is an environmental, safety or public health hazard shall be decommissioned.

All wells shall be tagged with a Department of Ecology unique well identification number. If you have an existing well and it does not have a tag, please contact the well-drilling coordinator at the regional Department of Ecology office issuing this decision. This tag shall remain attached to the well. If you are required to submit water measuring reports, reference this tag number.

Installation and maintenance of an access port as described in WAC 173-160- 291(3) is required.

**Measurements, Monitoring, Metering and Reporting**

In order to maintain a sustainable supply of water, pumping must be managed so that static water levels do not progressively decline from year to year. Static water levels shall be measured and recorded immediately prior to operating the pump for each seasonal aquaculture project and following full recovery of water levels at the completion of each project. Measurements shall be obtained using a consistent methodology and records maintained. Static water level is defined as the water level in a well when no pumping is occurring and the water level has fully recovered from previous pumping. Data collection shall include the following elements:

- Unique Well ID Number
- Measurement date and time
- Measurement method (air line, electric tape, pressure transducer, etc.)
- Measurement accuracy (to nearest foot, tenth of foot, etc.)
- Description of the measuring point (top of casing, sounding tube, etc.)
- Measuring point elevation above or below land surface to the nearest 0.1 foot
- Land surface elevation at the well head to the nearest foot.
- Static water level below measuring point to the nearest 0.1 foot

Static water level data shall be submitted upon request by the Department of Ecology.


**Schedule and Inspections**

Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access at reasonable times, to the project location, and to inspect at reasonable times, records of water use, wells, diversions, measuring devices and associated distribution systems for compliance with water law.


