### Provisions

#### Measurements, Monitoring, Metering and Reporting

An approved measuring device must be installed and maintained for each of the sources identified by this water right in accordance with the rule "Requirements for Measuring and Reporting Water Use", Chapter 173-173 WAC, which describes the requirements for data accuracy, device installation and operation, and information reporting. It also allows a water user to petition the Department of Ecology for modifications to some of the requirements.

#### Department of Fish and Wildlife Requirement(s)

The intake(s) shall be screened in accordance with Department of Fish and Wildlife screening criteria (pursuant to RCW 77.57.010, RCW 77.57.070, and RCW 77.57.040). No dam or weir shall be constructed in connection with this diversion.

#### Quantity Limits, Flow and Regulation

This change does not authorize an enlargement of those quantities in cubic feet per second or acre-feet per year as described under S4-16312(A1)P.

Two hundred thirteen (213) acres of the original place of use of Surface Water Permit S4-16312(A1)P shall be fallowed for the duration of the 2013 irrigation season. As such, only 1,000 acres remain authorized under S4-16312(A1)P for 2013. Irrigation occurring during the 2013 irrigation season within the fallowed 213 acres of the place of use of S4-16312(A1)P shall constitute a violation of the terms of this authorization, and will result in its immediate termination. Other enforcement actions, including but not limited to fines and/or penalties, may also follow as a result of a violation.

#### Water Use Efficiency

The water right holder is required to maintain efficient water delivery systems and use of up-to-date water conservation practices consistent with RCW 90.03.005.

#### Schedule and Inspections

This seasonal change shall expire at the end of the 2013 irrigation season, being October 31, 2013, at which time the transferred 213 acres of the place of use shall automatically revert back to that described under S4-16312(A1)P.

Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access at reasonable times, to the project location, and to inspect at reasonable times, records of water use, wells, diversions, measuring devices and associated distribution systems for compliance with water law.

**General Conditions**

The applicant is advised that the issuance of this seasonal change by Ecology does not convey a right of access to, or other right to use land, which you do not legally possess. Obtainment of such a right is a private matter between the applicant and the owner of the land.

Use of water under this authorization shall be contingent upon the water right holder's maintenance of efficient water delivery systems and use of up-to-date water conservation practices consistent with established regulation requirements and facility capabilities.

Nothing in this authorization shall be construed as satisfying other applicable federal, state, or local statutes, ordinances or regulations.

Ecology assumes no liability for the purchase and/or construction of any permanent facilities in conjunction with this seasonal change authorization. Applicants for seasonal change should not construe that a seasonal change will result in the granting of a permanent change of water right.

**Authorization**

Subject to existing rights and the provisions specified above, I ORDER the requested seasonal changes to transfer 213 acres to a new place of use under Change Application No. CS4-16312(A1)P@3, for the 2013 irrigation seasons only.

## BACKGROUND

This report serves as the written findings of fact concerning Seasonal Change Application Number CS4-16312(A1)P@3.

## Legal Requirements for Approval of Appropriation of Water

### *Public Notice*

RCW 90.03.280 requires that notice of a water right application be published once a week, for two consecutive weeks, in a newspaper of general circulation in the county or counties where the water is to be stored, diverted and used. Notice of this application was published in the Tri-City Herald on February 14 and 21 of 2013.

### *State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA)*

A water right application is subject to a SEPA threshold determination (i.e. an evaluation whether there are likely to be significant adverse environmental impacts) if any one of the following conditions are met:

- (a) It is a surface water right application for more than 1 cfs, unless that project is for agricultural irrigation, in which case the threshold is increased to 50 cfs, so long as that irrigation project will not receive public subsidies;
- (b) It is a groundwater right application for more than 2,250 gallons per minute;
- (c) It is an application that, in combination with other water right applications for the same project, collectively exceed the amounts above;
- (d) It is a part of a larger proposal that is subject to SEPA for other reasons (e.g. the need to obtain other permits that are not exempt from SEPA);
- (e) It is part of a series of exempt actions that, together, trigger the need to do a threshold determination, as defined under WAC 197-11-305.

Because this application does not meet any of these conditions, it is categorically exempt from SEPA and a threshold determination is not required.

## **INVESTIGATION**

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### **Proposed Change**

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The applicant proposes to transfer 213 acres approximately nine miles west and use a point of diversion (POD) on the Columbia River located approximately eight miles downstream. The proposed POD is already authorized under the parent document, S4-16312(A1)P.

### **Other Rights Appurtenant to the Place of Use**

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An existing water right certificate, S4-01335C, covers the proposed place of use. This certificate authorized the irrigation of 203 acres. By email, it was determined that the applicant has only need for a total of 235 acres of irrigation in the subject area. Any surplus water resulting from this change would be placed into the State's Trust Water Right Program (Trust) under a separate application.

### **Impairment Considerations**

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Impairment is an adverse impact on the physical availability of water for a beneficial use that is entitled to protection. A change to a water right may not be approved if it would:

- Interrupt or interfere with the availability of water to an adequately constructed groundwater withdrawal facility of an existing right. An adequately constructed groundwater withdrawal facility is one that (a) is constructed in compliance with well construction requirements and (b) fully penetrates the saturated zone of an aquifer or withdraws water from a reasonable and feasible pumping lift.
- Interrupt or interfere with the availability of water at the authorized point of diversion of a surface water right. A surface water right conditioned with instream flows may be impaired if a proposed use or change would cause the flow of the stream to fall to or below the instream flow more frequently or for a longer duration than was previously the case.
- Interrupt or interfere with the flow of water allocated by rule, water rights, or court decree to instream flows.
- Degrade the water quality of the source to the point that the water is unsuitable for beneficial use by existing users (e.g. via sea water intrusion).

For this change, no impairment is expected. The proposed POD is already authorized by the parent water right document, in use, and within the same pool on the Columbia River; the change is seasonal in POU only; and no enlargement to the instantaneous diversion rate and annual quantity is authorized by this change. Indeed, a large portion of surplus water may result from this change and placed into Trust to augment instream flows under a separate application.

### **Beneficial Use and Tentative Determination**

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The proposed use of water, irrigation, is defined in statute as a beneficial use (RCW 90.54.020(1)). No change in purpose is proposed. The instantaneous rate of diversion and annual quantity were not entered in the application and derive from last year's seasonal change authorization, CS4-16312(A1)P@2, as the same two circles are proposed for transfer under this application. Metering data submitted by the applicant provided a basis to calculate the tentative determination of these values. An in-depth discussion on the derivation of these values for that year can be found in the change authorization for CS4-16312(A1)@2. Restating that discussion here is of limited value

## Public Interest Considerations

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### *Consideration of Protests and Comments*

No protests were filed against this application.

The continued use of agricultural irrigation is considered a beneficial use and will continue to augment the economic vitality of the local area. Any surplus water resulting from this change may be placed into Trust, a benefit to aquatic species in the Columbia River.

### Conclusions

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Legal requirements for processing this seasonal change application for year 2013 have been met:

- 1) The notice of the proposal was correctly published,
- 2) A tentative determination on the rate and quantity of water to be diverted made,
- 3) Impairment is not expected, and
- 4) Detriment to the public interest is not expected.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

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Based on the above investigation and conclusions, I recommend that this request for a water right be approved in the amounts and within the limitations listed below and subject to the provisions listed above

### Purpose of Use and Authorized Quantities

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The amount of water seasonally transferred to the proposed place of use is a maximum limit and the water user may only use that amount of water within the specified limit that is reasonable and beneficial:

3.97 cfs

571 acre-feet per year

For the irrigation of 213 acres


