Re: Your request for a revised SHORT TERM AUTHORIZATION under Water Right Application G1-28709

This letter serves as a revised **Short Term Authorization** for the withdrawal of up to 30 gallons per minute, from a well, for a water-based process to reclaim and recycle spent lead shot at the Seattle Skeet & Trap (SST) facility in Ravensdale. **READ THIS LETTER CAREFULLY.** This Short Term Authorization is being issued for a four month period, beginning on April 4, 2012, and expiring on August 3, 2012. **This authorization supersedes the authorization issued on July 6, 2011.** Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of this Short Term Authorization will result in immediate cancellation.

The Department of Ecology (Ecology) received the subject application, signed by you, a trustee of SST, on June 9, 2011. You requested a Short Term Authorization to allow your contractor to withdraw up to 30 gallons per minute from an 8 inch x 140 foot well (Ecology ID # ACT 185) located on a parcel owned by King County. This parcel is leased by your organization from the King County Department of Executive Services/Facilities Management (DES/FM). Appropriately, the subject application was also signed by Robert Thompson of King County DES/FM.

Your requested point of withdrawal and place of use are within the NE¼ of Section 29, Township 22 North, Range 7 East, in King County. The site address is 26520 292nd Avenue SE #3, Ravensdale, WA. The parcel number for this site is 292207-9001.

Your contractor is going to reclaim lead shot deposited on the property from shotgun shooting sports. A "water-based" system for separating the lead shot from the soil materials will be used. Water will be stored in large holding tanks (approximately 25,000 gallons total) and pumped into the machine that separates the lead shot from the soil materials. Every attempt will be made to recycle as much water into the holding tanks as possible to reduce usage, but there will be some water loss during the process requiring the holding tanks to be refilled. All soil materials will be pre-screened to ½" size using a dry screen box process, prior to loading into the lead separation



machine where the water is used. The recovered lead shot will then be sent to a recycling facility.

Exact dates water will be needed depends on allowable SST work dates. If your contractor is provided 100% access to the SST facility, it is expected that the processing activity will take place in a time window from early-April 2012 to early-August 2012, involving approximately 4 weeks of actual water usage, 5 to 6 days a week, up to 10 hours per day. However, the processing will be less intense than this because the SST club will require the contractor to conduct work during days and times the club is not open, so actual water usage will be broken up in incremental periods (i.e., 5 to 11 am and/or 6 to 9 pm) per day. Based on a maximum of 10 hours of daily pumping, for 6 days a week, over the course of 4 weeks, approximately 432,000 gallons (1.33 acre feet) of water will need to be pumped. Actual pumpage from the well will be something less, because as much water as possible will be recycled.

Seattle Skeet & Trap is hereby granted a **Short Term Authorization** to proceed with the withdrawal and beneficial use of water as described above, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. This Short Term Authorization becomes effective on April 4, 2012.
2. This Short Term Authorization shall remain in effect through August 3, 2012, unless revoked sooner by Ecology if SST (or their contractor) fails to comply with these terms and conditions. If SST desires to terminate this Short Term Authorization prior to August 3, 2012, please do so in a written request to Ecology's Northwest Regional Office.
3. This authorization to make use of public waters of the state is subject to existing rights, including any existing rights held by the United States for the benefit of Tribes under treaty or settlement.
4. There is limited development and water use in the area of the SST facility, so impairment of other water rights is not anticipated. However, if impairment of other rights does occur, SST will be required to diminish or cease pumping.
5. Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access to the project location to inspect the SST water works for compliance with this Short Term Authorization.

You have a right to appeal this action to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this document. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this document:

- File your appeal and a copy of this document with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.

- Serve a copy of your appeal and this document on Ecology in paper form - by mail or in person. (See addresses below). Email is not accepted.


You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
