Re: Ground Water Permit No.'s G3-29314

Dear Mr. David:

In response to your request, you are hereby granted an extension to put the water to full beneficial use for the reason(s) below:

Ground Water Permit G3-29314 issued for 65 gallons per minute, 50 acre-feet per year for community domestic supply for 49 residential units. Ground Water Certificate G3-25769 issued for 36 gallons per minute, 46 acre-feet per year for the original project development from a different source well.

After review of the file it is determined that the instantaneous quantities of these authorizations are additive and the annual quantities are non-additive. The total quantity of water authorized for the Martin Creek Community Association is not to exceed 101 gallons per minute, 50 acre-feet per year under both rights.

This extension of the development schedule will allow for the opportunity for construction of the remaining residential units, evaluate additional well sources and complete development of Water System Plans for the Department of Health.

An approved measuring device shall be installed and maintained for each of the sources (wells) identified herein in accordance with the rule "Requirements for Measuring and Reporting Water Use", Chapter 173-173 WAC. Water use data including instantaneous and acre-feet shall be recorded monthly for each well and maintained by the property owner for a minimum of five years. The water use data shall be submitted annually during development of the permit. Seasonal monthly readings can be taken when weather and conditions do not allow reasonable access to the meters.

The rule above describes the requirements for data accuracy, device installation and operation, and information reporting. It also allows a water user to petition Ecology for modifications to some of the requirements. Installation, operation and maintenance requirements are enclosed as a document entitled "Water Measurement Device Installation and Operation Requirements".

Department of Ecology personnel, upon presentation of proper credentials, shall have access at reasonable times, to the records of water use that are kept to meet the above conditions, and to inspect at reasonable times any measuring device used to meet the above conditions.

The new deadline to submit your *Proof of Appropriation of Water* is January 1, 2020.



You have a right to appeal this action to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this document. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this document:

- File your appeal and a copy of this document with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this document on Ecology in paper form - by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) Email is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
