

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT: <p>The Yakima Adjudication Court confirmed James Ives an 1870 priority date water right under court claim number 02398 in Subbasin 23 (Ahtanum Creek).</p> <p>In 2004 James Ives applied to change to a point of diversion on Hatton Creek, located within the SE¹/₄SE¹/₄ of Section 8, T. 12 N., R. 17 E.W.M.</p> <p>The senior is authorized to divert water from a point on Ahtanum Creek located within the NE¹/₄SW¹/₄ of Section 17, and the junior right is confirmed to divert water from a point on Ahtanum Creek within the NE¹/₄NW¹/₄ of Section 17, T. 12 N., R. 17 E.W.M. The junior right can only be exercised when the flow in Ahtanum Creek exceeds 62.59 cfs <u>and</u> no uses are being made of the excess by water right holders on the reservation.</p> <p>The Report of the Court for the Ahtanum Creek Subbasin in the Yakima River Basin Water Rights Adjudication confirmed the same point of diversion, under the above mentioned water right, that was certified in the previous 1925 Ahtanum Creek Adjudication. Since that court proceeding, the property has been sub-divided resulting in multiple land ownership under the right. The applicants are currently proposing to change the points of diversion that they (or their predecessors) added years ago, and are currently using today.</p>
