NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:
 Applicants, Thomas E. Dillon (Dillon) and Dorothy Anna Clark (Clark) of Yakima, WA. filed an application to change the point of diversion. The subject court claim was confirmed through the Aquavella Adjudication. The point of diversion, currently authorized, is an abandoned gravity flow ditch as recognized in the report of the referee. Dillon and Clark are proposing to change their point of diversion to a pump diversion located on their property. Court Claim No. 02017 was confirmed 0.7 cfs up to 14 acre-feet per year for irrigation of 3.5 acres located on three individual parcels owned by three separate owners. Dillon and Clark own Lot 3, which contains 2.5 out of the 3.5 acres. Lot 1 is owned by the Collins and Lot 2 is owned by the Omlins. The referee of the court recommended a right be confirmed for the three lots combined and advised the individual lot owners to file applications with Ecology to change their point of diversion. Thus, the basis of this change application.
